PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia By His Excellency the Right Honorable Henry Stafford, BARON NORTHCOTE,
to wit. Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael
NORTHCOTE, and Saint George, Knight Grand Commander of the Most Eminent
Governor-General. Order of the Indian Empire, Companion of the Most Honorable
Order of the Bath, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the
Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor-General might appoint such times for holding the Sessions of the Parliament as he thinks fit, and also from time to time, by Proclamation or otherwise, prorogue the Parliament: And whereas on the eleventh day of June, One thousand nine hundred and eight, the Parliament was prorogued until the fifteenth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and eight, and it is expedient to further prorogue the said Parliament: Now therefore I, the said Henry Stafford, Baron Northcote, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Constitution, do, by this my Proclamation, further prorogue the said Parliament until the nineteenth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and eight.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth, at Melbourne, this fourteenth day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and eight, and in the eighth year of His Majesty's reign.
