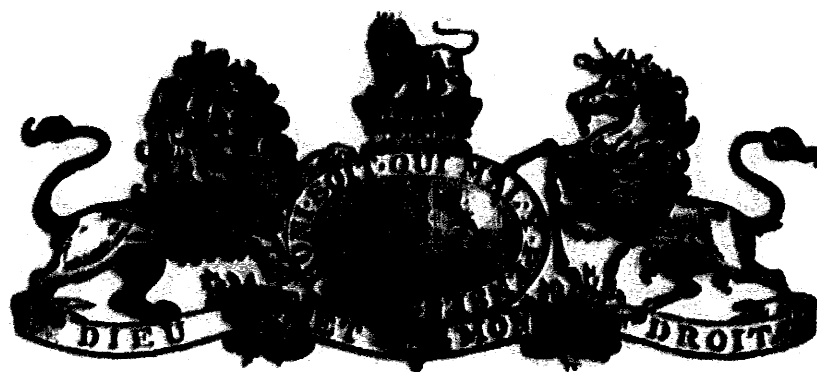

STATEMENT SHOWING THE RESULT OF THE REFERENDUM UPON A PROPOSED LAW TO ALTER THE PROVISIONS OF THE CONSTITUTION RELATING TO LEGISLATIVE POWERS.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the Writ of His Majesty the King to me directed, a proposed law for the alteration of the Constitution, entitled Constitution Alteration (Legislative Powers) 1910, was on the Twenty-sixth day of April, 1911, submitted according to law in each State to the electors qualified to vote for the election of Members of the House of Representatives: And whereas in pursuance of the *Referendum (Constitution Alteration) Act 1906-1909* a statement of the voting on the submission (which submission is in the said Act referred to as the Referendum) has been prepared and indorsed on the said Writ: And whereas by the said Act it is enacted that the Chief Electoral Officer shall publish a copy of that statement in the *Gazette*, and that the statement so published shall, subject to the said Act, be conclusive evidence of the result of the Referendum: Now therefore I do hereby certify that the statement hereunder set out is a true copy of the statement indorsed on the said Writ, and do publish the statement in the *Gazette* in pursuance of the said Act.
