PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of
Australia to wit.

DENMAN,
Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Denman, a Member of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Quarantine Act 1908* it is enacted that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation—

(1) Declare that any place in Australia is infected with a quarantinable disease or that a quarantinable disease may be brought or carried from or through that place; and (2) Declare any part of the Commonwealth in which any quarantinable disease exists to be a Quarantine Area; and (3) Declare that any persons or goods in any quarantine area, or in any part of the Commonwealth in which any quarantinable disease exists, shall be subject to quarantine:

And whereas a quarantinable disease, to wit, Small-pox, exists in the area comprised within a radius of 15 miles from the General Post Office, Sydney, in the State of New South Wales:

Now therefore I, Thomas, Baron Denman, Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby declare—

- (1) That the area comprised within a radius of 15 miles from the General Post Office, Sydney, in the said State, is infected with a quarantinable disease, to wit, Small-pox, and is a place from or through which the said quarantinable disease may be brought or carried to other parts of Australia;
- (2) That such area shall be a Quarantine Area; and
- (3) That all persons and goods in such area shall be subject to quarantine.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth this fourth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and in the fourth year of His Majesty's reign.

NOTIFICATION OF PROVISIONAL REGULATIONS AND OF INTENTION TO MAKE
REGULATIONS UNDER THE QUARANTINE ACT 1908-12.

PURSUANT to the *Rules Publication Act* 1908 notice is hereby given that—

1. His Excellency the Governor-General, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, was on the fourth day of July, 1913, pleased to make Provisional Regulations under the *Quarantine Act* 1908-12, relative to the proclaiming of a Quarantine Area at Sydney, to come into operation on the seventh day of July, 1913; which Provisional Regulations may be cited as Statutory Rules 1913, No. 194.

2. It is proposed to make Regulations under the *Quarantine Act* 1908-12, and the Provisional Regulations above-mentioned are the draft of the proposed Regulations.

3. Copies of the Provisional Regulations may be purchased at the Government Printing Office, Melbourne, and at the Customs Houses, Sydney, Brisbane, Port Adelaide, Fremantle, and Hobart, at the price of Threepence.

4. Any representations or suggestions made in writing by any person interested will be taken into consideration before finally settling the proposed Regulations.
