## PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of  
Australia to wit.

DENMAN,  
Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Denman, a Member of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Commonwealth of Australia.

**W**HEREAS by a proclamation issued in pursuance of the *Quarantine Act* 1908 it was declared—

That the area comprised within a radius of 15 miles from the General Post Office, Sydney, in the State of New South Wales, was infected with a quarantinable disease, Small-pox, and was a place from or through which the said quarantinable disease might be brought or carried to other parts of Australia; that such area should be a Quarantine Area; and that all persons and goods in such area should be subject to quarantine:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke the said proclamation:

Now therefore I, Thomas, Baron Denman, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said proclamation.

Provided that the said proclamation shall not be deemed to be revoked in regard to its effect so far as concerns any person leaving or having left the said quarantine area for the purpose of journeying to another State prior to the date of this proclamation.

Given under my hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth this twenty-sixth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and in the fourth year of His Majesty's reign.

NOTIFICATION OF PROVISIONAL REGULATION AND OF INTENTION TO MAKE A  
REGULATION UNDER THE QUARANTINE ACT 1908-1912.

PURSUANT to the *Rules Publication Act* 1903, notice is hereby given that—

- (1) His Excellency the Governor-General, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, was, on the 26th day of November, 1913, pleased to make a provisional Regulation under the *Quarantine Act* 1908-1912, relative to the quarantine of the metropolitan district of Sydney, to come into operation forthwith, which Provisional Regulation may be cited as Statutory Rules 1913, No. 301.
- (2) It is proposed to make a Regulation under the *Quarantine Act* 1908-12, and the Provisional Regulation above mentioned is the draft of the proposed Regulation.
- (3) Copies of the Provisional Regulation may be purchased at the Government Printing Office, Melbourne, and at the Customs Houses, Sydney, Brisbane, Port Adelaide, Fremantle, and Hobart, at the price of Threepence.
- (4) Any representations or suggestions made in writing by any person interested will be taken into consideration before finally settling the proposed Regulation.
