WAR PRECAUTIONS (PRICES) REGULATIONS 1916.

Melbourne, 4th January, 1919.

I, WALTER MASSY GREENE, a member of the Federal Executive Council, acting for and on behalf of the Minister of State for Defence, in pursuance of the War Precautions (Prices) Regulations 1916, and on the recommendation of the Chief Commissioner for Prices, do hereby order as follows:—

ORDER No. 539.

FOODSTUFFS.—QUEENSLAND.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Order No. 539, and shall come into force on the 6th day of January, 1919.

2. Prices Order No. 353, made on the 27th June, 1918, is hereby repealed.

ORDER No. 541.

FRY'S BREAKFAST COCOA.—COMMONWEALTH.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Order No. 541, and shall come into force on the 6th day of January, 1919.

2. Prices Order No. 535, made on the 14th December, 1918, is hereby repealed.

ORDER No. 542.

WHITE LEAD.—COMMONWEALTH.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Order No. 542, and shall come into force on the 6th day of January, 1919.

2. Prices Order No. 501, made on the 11th November, 1918, is hereby repealed.

3. This Order shall apply to all the proclaimed areas in the various States of the Commonwealth.


1. This Order may be cited as Prices Order No. 545, and shall come into force on the 6th day of January, 1919.

NOTE.—Fresh whole milk should be understood to be—the whole of the milk, whether pasteurized or otherwise, including the strippings, drawn at the time of milking; the term does not include milk which contains less than 3.3 per centum of butter-fat, or less than 8.5 per centum of solids other than butter-fat, or is mixed with any preservative or chemical or colouring matter of any kind whatsoever.

The expression "Necessary Commodities" means goods declared by the Minister, by notice in the Gazette, to be necessary commodities for the purposes of these Regulations.

Now therefore I, Walter Massy Greene, a member of the Federal Executive Council, acting for and on behalf of the Minister of State for Defence, do hereby declare as follows:—

The following shall be a "Necessary Commodity" for the purposes of the War Precautions (Prices) Regulations 1916, namely:—

Linseed.
