WAR PRECAUTIONS (PRICES) REGULATIONS 1916. DETERMINATION OF MAXIMUM PRICES.

Melbourne, 20th August, 1919.

I, WALTER MASSY GREENE, acting for the Minister of State for Defence, in pursuance of the War Precautions (Prices) Regulations 1916, and on the recommendation of the Chief Commissioner for Prices, do hereby order as follows:—

ORDER No. 611.

FLOUR.—TASMANIA.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Order No. 611, and shall come into force on the 21st day of August, 1919.
2. Prices Order No. 491, made on the 1st November, 1918, and so much of Prices Order No. 577, made on 20th February, 1919, as relates to Flour, are hereby repealed.
3. This Order shall apply to all the proclaimed areas in the State of Tasmania, as specified in the Schedule to this Order.
4. The maximum prices which may be charged for Flour shall, until further order, be as set out in the Schedule to this Order.
