## PROCLAMATION

Australia to wit.

R. M. FERGUSON, By His Excellency the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia,  
Governor-General.

**W**HEREAS by the *Navigation Act 1919* it is enacted that that Act shall commence on a day to be fixed by proclamation after the King's approval thereto has been proclaimed in the Commonwealth :

And whereas the King's approval to the said Act was proclaimed in the Commonwealth on the twentieth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and nineteen :

Now therefore I, Sir Ronald Craufurd Munro Ferguson, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby fix Tuesday, the twenty-third day of December, One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, as the day upon which the *Navigation Act 1919* shall commence.

## EXPORTATION OF CINEMATOGRAPH FILMS.

### PROCLAMATION

Australia to wit. By His Excellency the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia.  
R. M. FERGUSON, Governor-General.

**W**HEREAS by the *Customs Act 1901-1916* it is enacted that the Governor-General may by Proclamation prohibit the exportation of any goods the exportation of which would, in his opinion, be harmful to the Commonwealth :

And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor-General, the exportation of Cinematograph Films, unless the consent in writing of the Minister of State for Trade and Customs has first been obtained, would be harmful to the Commonwealth :

Now therefore I, Sir Ronald Craufurd Munro Ferguson, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby prohibit the exportation of Cinematograph Films, unless the consent in writing of the Minister of State for Trade and Customs has first been obtained.
