## PROCLAMATION

Australia to wit.

R. M. FERGUSON,  
Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia.

**W**HEREAS by the *Quarantine Act* 1908-1915 it is enacted that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation—

- (1) Declare that any place in Australia is infected with a quarantinable disease or that a quarantinable disease may be brought or carried from or through that place; and
- (2) Declare any part of the Commonwealth in which any quarantinable disease exists to be a Quarantine Area; and
- (3) Declare that any persons in any Quarantine Area or in any part of the Commonwealth in which any quarantinable disease exists shall be subject to quarantine:

And whereas a quarantinable disease, to wit, Pneumonic Influenza, exists in the State of South Australia;

Now therefore I, Sir Ronald Craufurd Munro Ferguson, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby declare—

- (1) That the State of South Australia is infected with a quarantinable disease, to wit, Pneumonic Influenza, and is a place from or through which the said quarantinable disease may be brought or carried to other parts of Australia:
- (2) That such State shall be a Quarantine Area:
- (3) That all persons and goods in such Quarantine Area shall be subject to quarantine.

This Proclamation may be cited as Quarantine Proclamation No. 41.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth this fifth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and in the ninth year of His Majesty's reign.

WAR PRECAUTIONS (PRICES) REGULATIONS 1916.

REPEAL OF ORDERS.

Melbourne, 31st January, 1919.

ORDER No. 568.

TIN PLATES AND SCRAP TIN—COMMONWEALTH.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Order No. 568, and shall come into force on the 3rd day of February, 1919.
2. Prices Orders No. 90, made on the 6th December, 1916, and No. 180, made on the 2nd October, 1917, are hereby repealed.

DECLARATION OF A NECESSARY COMMODITY.

ORDER No. 569.

WHEREAS by the War Precautions (Prices) Regulations 1916 it is enacted that—

The expression “Necessary Commodities” means goods declared by the Minister, by notice in the *Gazette*, to be necessary commodities for the purpose of these Regulations.

Now, therefore, I, Walter Massy Greene, acting for the Minister of State for Defence, do hereby declare as follows:—

The following shall be a “Necessary Commodity” for the purposes of the War Precautions (Prices) Regulations 1916, namely—

Butter Muslin.

DETERMINATION OF MAXIMUM PRICES.

Melbourne, 4th February, 1919.

I WALTER MASSY GREENE, acting for the Minister of State for Defence, in pursuance of the War Precautions (Prices) Regulations 1916, and on the recommendation of the Chief Commissioner for Prices, do hereby order as follows:—

ORDER No. 570.

PHENOL, VASELINE, BUTTER MUSLIN, OR GAUZE—COMMONWEALTH.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Order No. 570, and shall come into force on the 5th day of February, 1919.
2. This Order shall apply to all proclaimed areas in the various States of the Commonwealth.
3. The maximum prices which may be charged in any area to which this Order applies for Phenol, Vaseline, and Butter Muslin, or Gauze shall, until further order, be the prices generally prevailing in any such area on the 24th day of January, 1919.

ORDER No. 571.

BACON AND HAMS—QUEENSLAND.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Order No. 571, and shall come into force on the 5th day of February, 1919.
2. Prices Order No. 267, made on the 27th February, 1918, is hereby repealed.
3. This Order shall apply to all the proclaimed areas in the State of Queensland.
4. The maximum prices which may be charged for Bacon and Hams in the areas specified shall, until further order, be as set out in the Schedule to this Order.
