QUARANTINE STATION—LYTTON.

PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. By His Excellency the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia.
R. M. FERGUSON,
Governor-General.

WHEREAS by the *Quarantine Act 1908-1915* it is enacted that the Governor-General may, by proclamation, appoint places on land or sea to be quarantine stations for the performance of quarantine by vessels, persons, or goods:

And whereas by a Proclamation published in the *Gazette* of 6th April, 1916, an area at Lytton, in the State of Queensland, was appointed as a Quarantine Station for the performance of quarantine by persons and goods:

And whereas it is desirable to repeal the said Proclamation, and to appoint the area at Lytton, in the State of Queensland, hereinafter described, as a Quarantine Station for the performance of quarantine by persons or goods:

Now therefore I, Sir Ronald Craufurd Munro Ferguson, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby repeal the said Proclamation, and I do hereby appoint all that area, more particularly described in the attached Schedule, to be a Quarantine Station for the performance of quarantine by persons or goods.

This Proclamation may be cited as Quarantine Proclamation No. 42.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth this 8th day of February, One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and in the ninth year of His Majesty's reign.

SCHEDULE.

All that piece or parcel of land in the town of Lytton, parish of Tingalpa, county of Stanley, State of Queensland, Commonwealth of Australia, described as follows:—

Commencing at a point on the right bank of the Brisbane River, being the north-west corner of allotment 1, section 25, town of Lytton; thence north-easterly by a line, being the north-western boundary of allotment 1, section 25, a line across a road, and the north-western boundary of allotment 1, section 23, town of Lytton; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of allotments 1, 2, and 3 of section 23; thence easterly by a line, being the southern boundary of allotment 4, section 23, a line across a road, and the southern boundaries of allotments 7, 6, and 5 of section 24; thence northerly and easterly along the western and northern boundaries respectively of the School Reserve; thence by a line, being the production north-easterly of the south-eastern boundary of the School Reserve, to a point on the high-water mark of Moreton Bay; thence generally northerly, north-westerly, and westerly by that high-water mark to its intersection with the right bank of the Brisbane River beforementioned; and thence upwards by part of that bank of that river to the commencing point.
