WAR PRECAUTIONS (COAL) REGULATIONS.

ORDER.

I WILLIAM ALEXANDER WATT, Acting Prime Minister of the Commonwealth of Australia, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by Regulation 10A of the War Precautions (Coal) Regulations, do hereby suspend all contracts or agreements for the supply of coal by the owners or lessees of all coal mines in the State of New South Wales.

The suspension shall have effect until otherwise notified by me by notice in the *Gazette*, or by notice served upon each party to the contracts or agreements.
