PROCLAMATION

R. M. FERGUSON,
Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Quarantine Act 1908-1915* it is enacted that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation—

- (1) Declare that any place in Australia is infected with a quarantinable disease or that a quarantinable disease may be brought or carried from or through that place; and
- (2) Declare any part of the Commonwealth in which any quarantinable disease exists to be a Quarantine Area; and
- (3) Declare that any persons in any Quarantine Area or in any part of the Commonwealth in which any quarantinable disease exists shall be subject to quarantine:

And whereas a quarantinable disease, to wit, Influenza, exists in the State of Queensland:

Now therefore I, Sir Ronald Craufurd Munro Ferguson, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby declare—

- (1) That the State of Queensland is infected with a quarantinable disease, to wit, Influenza, and is a place from or through which the said quarantinable disease may be brought or carried to other parts of Australia.
- (2) That such State shall be a Quarantine Area.
- (3) That all persons and goods in such Quarantine Area shall be subject to quarantine.

This Proclamation may be cited as Quarantine Proclamation No. 50.

BRUSHES OR TOILET ARTICLES CONTAINING OR MADE FROM THE HAIR OF ANIMALS.

PROCLAMATION

Australia to wit.
R. M. FERGUSON,
Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Quarantine Act 1908-1915* it is enacted that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, prohibit the importation into Australia of any articles likely, in his opinion, to introduce any infectious or contagious disease, and that the power of prohibition shall extend to prohibition generally or with limitations as to place and subject-matter, and either absolutely or subject to any special conditions or restrictions:

And whereas by a Proclamation issued in pursuance of the said Act and published in the *Gazette* of 7th November, 1918, the importation from certain countries of shaving brushes or other toilet articles made from the hair of animals was prohibited subject to certain conditions:

And whereas it is desirable to modify the said Proclamation:

Now therefore I, Sir Ronald Craufurd Munro Ferguson, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby repeal the said Proclamation, and I do hereby prohibit the importation into Australia from Eastern and South-Eastern Asia, India, Ceylon, Japan, the East Indian Islands, and the Philippine Islands of brushes of any description or toilet articles containing or made from the hair of animals, unless a certificate from a responsible official of the Health Department of the country of origin is produced within 60 days of the arrival of the goods in Australia, satisfactorily identifying them and certifying that the hair contained in them or from which they are made was effectively cleansed and disinfected before manufacture.

This Proclamation may be cited as *Quarantine Proclamation No. 48*.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the *Enemy Contracts Annulment Act 1915* it is provided (*inter alia*) that any party to a contract may file with the Attorney-General of the Commonwealth a copy of the contract, and apply to him for a declaration that the contract is or is not an enemy contract within the meaning of that section:

And whereas copies of the contracts set out in the Schedule hereto have been filed with the Attorney-General of the Commonwealth by the Sulphide Corporation Limited, a party to the said contracts, and application has been made to him for a declaration that the contracts are or are not enemy contracts within the meaning of the said section:

Now therefore I, Littleton Ernest Groom, a Minister of State for the Commonwealth, acting for and on behalf of the Attorney-General of the Commonwealth, do hereby declare that the contracts set out in the Schedule hereto are enemy contracts within the meaning of section 3 of the *Enemy Contracts Annulment Act 1915*.

NOTIFICATION OF VACANCIES.

APPLICATIONS will be received from persons qualified for appointment to the positions specified below.

Applicants outside the Public Service are eligible for appointment to the Administrative and Professional Divisions, but are not eligible for appointment to Clerical or General Division vacancies, unless they were in the service of a State on 1st January, 1901, or are at present permanent officers in the service of a State, or have retired from the service of the Commonwealth or of a State.

Applications must be in the applicant's handwriting, should show fully qualifications for the position sought, and must, to insure consideration, be forwarded to the Public Service Inspector in the State in which the vacancy exists in time to reach the office of the Public Service Inspector not later than the date shown in each case.

In the case of officers of the Commonwealth Public Service applications should be forwarded through the Department to which the officer is attached.

In the case of applicants who are officers of the Public Service of the Commonwealth or of a State the following particulars should be set out at the foot of the application:—

- Designation
- Office or Branch
- Age last birthday (in years)
- Length in service (in years)
- Salary (per annum)
- Date of receipt of present salary

Applicants from outside the Service should state full name and date and year of birth. Copies only of diplomas, references, testimonials, or certificates should be forwarded. If the originals are required they will be asked for.

Minimum and maximum salaries where shown indicate the limits of the class or grade in which the position is classified. Subject to the provisions of the Public Service Act appointments may be made at any salary within those limits. Successful appointees must comply with the life assurance provisions of the Public Service Act and Regulations.

Officers of the Public Service should note that in any case where the minimum salary of a position in the Clerical Division is not the minimum salary of a Class, and the successful applicant is not eligible for the former by reason of not having received the salary of the next lower subdivision for twelve months, he will be granted an allowance equal to the difference between the salary for which he is eligible and the minimum salary of the position until he can be advanced by annual subdivisional increments to the latter salary.

Where vacancies are notified in positions which have been the subject of award, the minimum and maximum salaries shown are those prescribed by the award. If the officer appointed to any such position is eligible to become, but is not, a member of the organization which obtained the award, he can only be paid the rates of salary prescribed in the Public Service Act or Regulations for the position to which he has been appointed, unless and until he becomes a member of the organization, when the award rates shall apply.

Officers who may be transferred without promotion or increase of salary, as the result of an application for an advertised vacancy, will be required to pay their own expenses of removal unless the transfer comes within the conditions prescribed in Public Service Regulation No. 54.

Particulars of existing quarters are furnished merely for the information of officers. It is not incumbent on Departments to provide quarters, which, if provided, may be wholly or partially withdrawn at any time.
