WHEREAS by the *Quarantine Act 1908-1915*, it is enacted that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, declare any ports in Australia to be first ports of entry for over-sea vessels, and that the power to declare first ports of entry shall extend to authorize the declaration of a port to be a first port of entry for all over-sea vessels, or for over-sea vessels from any particular place, or for any class of over-sea vessels:

And whereas it is desirable to declare the port of Wyndham in the State of Western Australia to be a first port of entry for vessels arriving from over-sea:

Now therefore I, Sir Ronald Craufurd Munro Ferguson, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby declare the port of Wyndham to be a first port of entry for vessels arriving from over-sea.

This Proclamation may be cited as Quarantine Proclamation No. 49.

And whereas by the said Proclamation it is further provided that nothing in the Proclamation shall be taken to prohibit anything which shall be expressly permitted by the licence of a Secretary of State whether such licence be especially granted to individuals or be announced as applying to classes of persons:

And whereas by a further Proclamation issued by His Majesty the King in Council on the eighth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and published in the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* on the twelfth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, it is amongst other things provided that the power to grant licences on behalf of His Majesty, vested by the first recited Proclamation in a Secretary of State, may be exercised in Australia by the Governor-General:

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Now therefore I, Sir Ronald Craufurd Munro Ferguson, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby give and grant full licence and authority unto and do hereby permit all persons resident carrying on business or being in the Commonwealth to trade and have commercial and financial transactions with any person resident or carrying on business in the territory of Austria-Hungary now in the occupation of the Armies of Great Britain and her Allies:

Provided that any licence or permission which may be necessary in respect of any transactions under any prohibition of export or prohibition of import for the time being in force in the Commonwealth or in respect of any remittance of money out of the Commonwealth is first obtained:

Provided also that this Licence shall not permit any person to pay to or for the benefit of any person resident or carrying on business in the said territory any sum of money which by the terms of the *Trading with the Enemy Act 1914-1916* is required to be paid to the Public Trustee appointed under that Act, but such sums must be paid to the said Public Trustee:

Provided further that this Licence shall not permit any person to pay or deliver to or on behalf of any persons resident or carrying on business in the said territory any sums of money or property of which by the terms of the *Trading with the Enemy Act 1914-1916* notice has been or ought to have been given prior to the date of this Licence to the said Public Trustee.
