THE WAR PRECAUTIONS (COAL) REGULATIONS.

Direction as to Wages.

WHEREAS by Sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 10g of the War Precautions (Coal) Regulations it is provided that the Prime Minister may, if he thinks fit, give directions as to the rates of wages of persons employed in, or in connexion with, the production of coal at any coal mine in the Commonwealth other than a coal mine in relation to which an order has been made by the Prime Minister in pursuance of paragraph (2) (b) of Regulation 10A of the War Precautions (Coal) Regulations:

And whereas an order has not been made by the Prime Minister in pursuance of paragraph (2) (b) of Regulation 10A of those Regulations in relation to any coal mine in the State of Victoria:

Now therefore I, William Alexander Watt, the Acting Prime Minister of the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby direct that the rates of wages of persons employed in, or in C.9251,

connexion with, the production of coal at all coal mines in the State of Victoria other than the following mines, namely:—

- (a) Hudson's Austral Colliery, Korumburra; and
- (b) any mine producing brown coal,

shall be the following rates, namely:—

The rates prevailing on the twenty-ninth day of May, 1919, plus 15 per cent. of such rates:

Provided that the minimum rate for adult workers, other than stablemen, shall be 12s. 9d. per day, and the minimum rate for stablemen shall be 12s. 3d. per day.

And I declare that this direction shall take effect on and from the commencement of the pay fortnight commencing next after the twenty-ninth day of May, 1919.

ORDER

Varying Contracts for the Supply of Coal Produced in Victoria.

WHEREAS by Regulation 10G of the War Precautions (Coal) Regulations it is provided that where the Prime Minister has given directions as to the rates of wages of persons employed in, or in connexion with, the production of coal at any coal mine in the Commonwealth, he may by order declare that any contract or agreement for the supply of coal by the owner or lessee of that mine is varied in such manner as is specified in the order:

And whereas the Acting Prime Minister has given directions as to the rates of wages of persons employed in, or in connexion with, the production of coal at all coal mines in the State of Victoria other than Hudson's Austral Colliery, Korumburra, and any mine producing brown coal:

Now therefore I, William Alexander Watt, the Acting Prime Minister aforesaid, do hereby declare that all contracts and agreements existing at the date of this order for the supply of coal produced at all mines in the State of Victoria other than the following mines, namely:—

- (a) Hudson's Austral Colliery, Korumburra; and
- (b) any mine producing brown coal,

are varied so that the prices for coal supplied under the contracts and agreements on and after the fifth day of June, 1919, shall be the prices respectively specified in the contracts and agreements, plus Three shillings per ton.
