## THE WAR PRECAUTIONS (COAL) REGULATIONS.

### ORDER

#### Directions as to Wages.—Mount Nicholas and Cornwall Coal Mines, Tasmania.

WHEREAS by Sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 10G of the War Precautions (Coal) Regulations it is provided that the Prime Minister may, if he thinks fit, give directions as to the rates of wages of persons employed in or in connexion with the production of coal at any coal mine in the Commonwealth other than a coal mine in relation to which an Order has been made by the Prime Minister in pursuance of paragraph (2) (b) of Regulation 10A of the War Precautions (Coal) Regulations:

And whereas an Order has not been made by the Prime Minister in pursuance of paragraph (2) (b) of Regulation 10A of those Regulations in relation to any coal mine in the State of Tasmania:

Now therefore I, William Alexander Watt, the Acting Prime Minister of the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby direct that the rates of wages of persons employed in or in connexion with the production of coal at the Mount Nicholas Coal Mine and the Cornwall Coal Mine, in the State of Tasmania, shall be the following rates, namely:—

For contract workers—the rates prevailing on the fourteenth day of June, 1919, plus 15 per cent. of such rates.

For adult day workers—the rates prevailing on the fourteenth day of June, 1919, plus 2s. per day.

For day workers other than adults—the rates prevailing on the fourteenth day of June, 1919, plus such amount per day as bears to 2s. the same proportion as the then prevailing rate for those workers bears to the then prevailing rate for adult day workers:

And I declare that such wages shall be payable as from the sixteenth day of June, 1919.

## THE WAR PRECAUTIONS (COAL) REGULATIONS.

### ORDER

#### Varying Contracts for the Supply of Coal produced at the Mount Nicholas and Cornwall Coal Mines, Tasmania.

WHEREAS by Regulation 10G of the War Precautions (Coal) Regulations it is provided that where the Prime Minister has given directions as to the rates of wages of persons employed in or in connexion with the production of coal at any coal mine in the Commonwealth, he may by Order declare that any contract or agreement existing at the date of

the Order, for the supply of coal produced at that mine, is varied in such manner as is specified in the Order in relation to all coal supplied on or after the date specified in the Order:

And whereas the Acting Prime Minister has given directions as to the rates of wages of persons employed in or in connexion with the production of coal at the Mount Nicholas Coal Mine and the Cornwall Coal Mine, in the State of Tasmania:

Now therefore I, William Alexander Watt, the Acting Prime Minister aforesaid, do hereby declare that all contracts and agreements existing at the date of this Order, for the supply of coal produced at the Mount Nicholas Coal Mine and the Cornwall Coal Mine aforesaid, are varied so that the prices for coal supplied under the contracts and agreements on and after the sixteenth day of June, 1919, shall be the prices respectively specified in the contracts and agreements plus Two shillings and sixpence per ton.

## THE WAR PRECAUTIONS (COAL) REGULATIONS.

### ORDER

#### Direction as to Wages (Queensland).

WHEREAS by Sub-Regulation (1) of Regulation 10G of the War Precautions (Coal) Regulations it is provided that the Prime Minister may, if he thinks fit, give directions as to the rates of wages of persons employed in or in connexion with the production of coal at any coal mine in the Commonwealth other than a coal mine in relation to which an Order has been made by the Prime Minister in pursuance of paragraph (2) (b) of Regulation 10A of the War Precautions (Coal) Regulations:

And whereas an Order has not been made by the Prime Minister in pursuance of paragraph (2) (b) of Regulation 10A of those Regulations in relation to any coal mine in the State of Queensland:

Now therefore I, William Alexander Watt, the Acting Prime Minister of the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby direct that the rates of wages of persons employed in or in connexion with the production of coal at all mines in the State of Queensland shall be the rates prevailing on the first day of June, 1919, plus the following:—

Miners and other contract workers.—15 per cent. of such rates.

Adult day wage off hand employees.—2s. 7d. per day:

And I declare that such rates of wages shall be payable as from the 2nd day of June, 1919.

ORDER

Varying Contracts for the Supply of Coal in Queensland.

WHEREAS by Regulation 10g of the War Precautions (Coal) Regulations it is provided that where the Prime Minister has given directions as to the rates of wages of persons employed in or in connexion with the production of coal at any coal mine in the Commonwealth, he may by Order declare that any contract or agreement, existing at the date of the Order, for the supply of coal at that mine, is varied in such manner as is specified in the Order in relation to all coal supplied on or after the date specified in the Order:

And whereas the Acting Prime Minister has given directions as to the rates of wages of persons employed in or in connexion with the production of coal at all coal mines in the State of Queensland:

Now therefore I, William Alexander Watt, the Acting Prime Minister aforesaid, do hereby declare that all contracts and agreements existing at the date of this Order for the supply of coal produced at the following mines are varied so that the prices for coal supplied under the contracts and agreements on and after the second day of June, 1919, shall be the prices hereinafter respectively specified in relation to those mines:—

Queensland Collieries  
Torbanlea Colliery  
Dundee Colliery  
Burgowan Colliery

The Mount Mulligan Mine

Blair Athol Colliery  
Newcastle Coal Co.  
Co-operative Colliery  
Bluff Colliery

The prices provided in the contracts or agreements, plus 4s. 3d. per ton.

The prices provided in the contracts or agreements, plus 3s. 3d. per ton.

The rates fixed on the 12th August, 1918, by Order No. 25, made by the Coal Board constituted under the War Precautions (Coal) Regulations, plus 2s. 9d. per ton.

Provided that in the case of any contract or agreement for the supply of coal from any of the above-mentioned mines, under which the vendor is required to deliver coal at a distance from the pit-head and to pay freight on the coal so delivered, the prices provided in this Order in relation to that coal may be increased by an amount sufficient to meet any increase, made after the date of this Order, in the freight on such coal.

WAR PRECAUTIONS (COAL) REGULATIONS.

I, ALEXANDER POYNTON, Acting Minister of State for the Navy, in pursuance of the War Precautions (Coal) Regulations (Statutory Rules 1917, No. 195, as amended by Statutory Rules 1917, No. 240 and No. 252), and on the recommendation of the Central Coal Board, do hereby order as follows:—

USE AND CONSUMPTION OF GAS IN THE STATE OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

1. On and after midnight on Thursday, 3rd July, 1919, the use and consumption of gas supplied by the city of Perth Electricity and Gas Department and the Fremantle Gas Company in the metropolitan area of Perth and Fremantle are prohibited for all purposes in private houses and shops on each day except between the hours of 5.30 a.m. and 8.30 a.m. and between the hours of 5 p.m. and 10 p.m.

2. Gas to the extent to which its use and consumption are permitted may be used only upon the condition that the stop-cocks at the meter are turned off, and kept turned off, during the prohibited hours.
