AN ORDINANCE

Relating to Appeals from Justices.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Northern Territory Acceptance Act 1910*, and the *Northern Territory (Administration) Act 1910*, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Justices' Appeals Ordinance 1919*. Short title.

2. Where a person convicted before a Justice has lodged an appeal, the Justice may either pronounce judgment on the conviction and respite execution of the judgment, or postpone the judgment until the appeal has been heard, and may either commit the person convicted to prison or admit him to bail or recognisance with or without sureties, and in such sum as he thinks fit, conditioned duly to prosecute such appeal and to abide the order of the Court thereon, or the event of the appeal, and to pay such costs as may be awarded by the court of appeal, and to comply with such other conditions as the Justice may think fit.

REVOCATION OF SO MUCH OF PROCLAMATION AS RELATES TO THE EXPORTATION OF TANNING SUBSTANCES OF ALL KINDS, INCLUDING EXTRACTS FOR USE IN TANNING.

PROCLAMATION

Australia to wit.

By His Excellency the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Customs Act 1901-1916* it is, amongst other things, enacted that in time of war the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, prohibit the exportation of any goods, and that the power above-mentioned extends to authorize the prohibition of the exportation of goods generally or to any specified place, and either absolutely or so as to allow of the exportation of the goods subject to any condition or restriction:

And whereas by a Proclamation issued on the twenty-eighth day of June, 1916, and published in the *Commonwealth Gazette* of the twenty-ninth day of June, 1916, the exportation of, *inter alia*, tanning substances of all kinds, including extracts for use in tanning, was prohibited unless the consent of the Minister of State for Defence had first been obtained.

And whereas it is desirable to revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the goods mentioned in the second recital hereto:

Now therefore I, Sir Ronald Craufurd Munro Ferguson, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the goods mentioned in the second recital hereto. (T. & C. 19/A/5592.)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Northern Territory Acceptance Act 1910* any power vested by an Act of the State of South Australia continued in force in the Northern Territory in the Governor is vested in the Governor-General:

And whereas by the *Northern Territory Crown Lands Act 1890* (an Act of the State of South Australia continued in force in the Northern Territory) the Governor may by Proclamation resume the whole or any portion of reserved lands:

And whereas by Proclamation made by His Excellency the Governor of South Australia on 7th day of January, 1904, certain Crown lands were, as set out in Schedule hereto, reserved for water conservation and police purposes: Now therefore I, Sir Ronald Craufurd Munro Ferguson, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby resume the whole of the lands included in the Proclamation aforesaid.

SCHEDULE.

Commencing at a point bearing 198 degrees 30 minutes and distant 11 chains from the south-west corner of police station

at Anthony's Lagoon, Northern Territory of South Australia; thence on a bearing of 330 degrees for 160 chains; thence on a bearing of 52 degrees for 160 chains; thence on a bearing of 150 degrees for 160 chains; and thence on a bearing of 232 degrees for 160 chains to the point of commencement.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth the tenth day of July, One thousand nine hundred (L.S.) and nineteen, in the tenth year of His Majesty's reign.

By His Excellency the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Regulation 2 of the War Precautions (Supplementary) Regulations 1916 it is amongst other things enacted that no person shall, after the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and sixteen, without the authority of the Governor-General or a Minister of State, proof whereof shall lie upon the person accused, assume or use in connexion with any trade, business, calling, or profession any word or mark notified by the Governor-General, by notice in the *Gazette*, to be for the purposes of the Regulation a prohibited word or mark:

Now therefore I, Sir Ronald Craufurd Munro Ferguson, the Governor-General aforesaid, do hereby declare the words "Australian Imperial Force" and the mark "A.I.F." to be prohibited words and a prohibited mark, respectively, for the purposes of the above-mentioned Regulation.

DETERMINATION OF MAXIMUM PRICES.**

ORDER No. 606.

BUTTER.—WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

Melbourne, 9th July, 1919.

I WALTER MASSY GREENE, acting for the Minister of State for Defence, in pursuance of the War Precautions (Prices) Regulations 1916, and on the recommendation of the Chief Commissioner for Prices, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Order No. 606, and shall come into force on the 10th day of July, 1919.
2. Prices Order No. 598, made on the 23rd day of May, 1919, is hereby amended as follows:—

By substituting, in the Schedule for Western Australia, for the figures "217s." and "2s. 2d.", the figures "207s. 8d." and "2s. 1d." respectively.

3. This Order shall apply to all the proclaimed areas in the State of Western Australia specified in the Schedule to Order No. 598.
