## PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Henry William, Baron Forster, a Member of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Commonwealth of Australia.

**W**HEREAS by the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor-General may appoint such times for holding the Sessions of the Parliament as he thinks fit, and also from time to time by Proclamation, or otherwise, prorogue the Parliament: Now therefore I, Henry William, Baron Forster, the Governor-General aforesaid, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Constitution, do by this my Proclamation prorogue the said Parliament until 15th March, 1922.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth, at Melbourne, this fifth day of January, in the year (L.S.) of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and in the twelfth year of His Majesty's reign.
