PROCLAMATION

Australia to wit.
FORSTER,
Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-
General of the Commonwealth of
Australia.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation (hereinafter referred to as "the said Proclamation") dated the twenty-eighth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and published in the *Gazette* of the twenty-ninth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the *Navigation Act 1912-1920*, fixed the first day of February, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, as the date upon which the following Part and Sections of the said Act, namely:—

Sections 11, 12, 13, 26, 28 to 42-inclusive, 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, 51 to 76 inclusive, 78 to 84 inclusive, 86, 87, 89, 90, 93, 94, 99 to 115 inclusive, 127 to 131 inclusive, 133, 134, 139, 140, 142 to 148 inclusive, 164 to 176 inclusive; Part III. (namely, sections 177 to 186 inclusive); sections 388, 390, 397, 398, 406, 410, 411, 412, 415, 417, 418, and 419,

shall commence:

And whereas by the said Act it is enacted that notwithstanding that a date has been fixed for the commencement of any Part, Division, Section or Schedule, such date of commencement may, at any time prior to that date, be postponed to such later date as is fixed by Proclamation:

And whereas it is desirable that the date of commencement of the Part and Sections aforesaid be postponed:

Now therefore I, Henry William, Baron Forster, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby postpone to the first day of March, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, the date of commencement of the Part and Sections specified in the said Proclamation.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth, at Melbourne, this twenty-first day of January, in the (L.S.) year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and in the twelfth year of His Majesty's reign.
