THE SCHEDULE.

THE ENEMY CONTRACTS ANNULMENT ACT 1915.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the *Enemy Contracts Annulment Act* 1915 it is provided (*inter alia*) that any party to a contract may file with the Attorney-General of the Commonwealth a copy of the contract, and apply to him for a declaration that the contract is or is not an enemy contract within the meaning of the section :

And whereas a copy of the contract set out in the Schedule hereto has been filed with the Attorney-General of the Commonwealth, and application has been made to him for a declaration that the contract is or is not, an enemy contract within the meaning of the said section :

Now therefore I, Littleton Ernest Groom, the Attorney-General of the Commonwealth, do hereby declare that the contract set out in the Schedule hereto is not an enemy contract within the meaning of section 3 of the *Enemy Contracts Annulment Act* 1915.

10th September, 1914	The Broken Hill South Silver Mining Company No Liability and The Australian Metal Company Limited	Variation to the following extent of a prior contract of 22nd July, 1911, for the sale and purchase of the output of certain lead sulphide concentrates from the mining company's mine at Broken Hill, viz., the substitution for the following provision :— "The prices of both metals, <i>i.e.</i> , lead and silver, for final settlement to be the average of the quotations during the third month after delivery", of the following provision :— "Final settlement for the lead contents in the deliveries made during the months of May, June, and July, 1914, to be made on the prices which will be actually realized for the metal produced from the ore, the Buyer agreeing to guarantee the Seller a minimum price for the lead of £14 per ton."
