PROCLAMATION

Australia to wit.

FORSTER,
Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Tariff Board Act 1921* it is enacted that that Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by Proclamation.

Now therefore I, Henry William, Baron Forster, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby fix Wednesday, the fifteenth day of March, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, as the date upon which the said Act shall come into operation.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth, at Melbourne, this fifteenth day of March, in (L.S.) the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and in the twelfth year of His Majesty's reign.
