THE NORTHERN TERRITORY OF AUSTRALIA.

No. 5 of 1922.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Supreme Court Ordinance 1911-1921.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Northern Territory Acceptance Act 1910-1919* and the *Northern Territory (Administration) Act 1910*, as follows :—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Supreme Court Ordinance 1922*. Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Supreme Court Ordinance 1911-1921* is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Supreme Court Ordinance 1911-1922*.

2. Section eleven of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting the word "Registrar" and inserting in its stead the word "Clerk." Appointment of officers.

3. Section thirteen of the Principal Ordinance is amended— Rules of procedure.

(a) by omitting from sub-section (2.) thereof the word "Registrar" (second occurring) and inserting in its stead the words "Clerk of the Supreme Court"; and

(b) by adding at the end of sub-section (2.) the following proviso :—
"Provided that the Judge of the Northern Territory may from time to time (if and so far as he thinks proper and convenient) himself exercise such powers and functions."
