PROCLAMATION

Australia to wit.
W. H. IRVINE,
Deputy of the
Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Deputy of
the Governor-General of the Com-
monwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Customs Tariff (New Zealand Preference) 1922* it is enacted that that Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by Proclamation:

Now therefore I, Sir William Hill Irvine, the Deputy of the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby fix the first day of September, 1922, as the date upon which the said Act shall come into operation.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth, at Melbourne, this twenty-fourth day of (L.S.) August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and in the thirteenth year of His Majesty's reign.

PROCLAMATION

Australia to wit.

By His Excellency the Deputy of
the Governor-General of the Com-
monwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section four of the *Customs Tariff (New Zealand Preference) 1922* it is enacted that from and after a time and date to be fixed by Proclamation the duties of Customs on the goods to which that section relates shall be in accordance with the rates indicated in that section:

Now therefore I, Sir William Hill Irvine, the Deputy of the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby fix the first day of September, 1922, at Nine o'clock in the forenoon, reckoned according to the standard time in the State of Victoria, as the date and time of the imposition of the said duties of Customs.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth, at Melbourne, this twenty-fourth day of (L.S.) August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and in the thirteenth year of His Majesty's reign.
