*Customs Tariff (Industries Preservation) Act 1921.*

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 9.

IN pursuance of section 9 of the *Customs Tariff (Industries Preservation) Act 1921*, I, Arthur Stanislaus Rodgers, Minister of State for Trade and Customs, hereby notify that, after inquiry and report by the Tariff Board, I am satisfied that the exchange value of the currency of Germany, being the country of origin or export of the undermentioned goods (which are of a class or kind manufactured in the United Kingdom), has depreciated in comparison with the currency of the United Kingdom, and that by reason of such depreciation those goods have been or are being sold to an importer in Australia at an export price which is less than the fair market value in the United Kingdom, as defined in that section, of goods of like character or quality made in the United Kingdom, and that in my opinion the provisions of section 9 of the said Act should apply to those goods:—

Mechanical Toys originated in or exported from Germany.

This notice may be cited as "Industries Preservation Act Notice No. 2," and shall have effect in relation to all such goods entered for home consumption on and after the 11th August, 1922.
