PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918-1922* it is provided—

- (1) that each Division shall be divided into Subdivisions and that the boundaries of each Subdivision shall be as specified by Proclamation; and

- (2) that new Rolls for any Subdivisions, Divisions, or States shall be prepared whenever directed by Proclamation, and that the Proclamation may specify the manner in which the Rolls shall be prepared:

And whereas by the *Northern Territory Representation Act 1922*, it is provided that subject to that Act, the provisions of the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1922* shall apply with such exceptions and subject to such modifications and adaptations as are prescribed in the Northern Territory in like manner as if the Northern Territory were an Electoral Division:

And whereas the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918-1922* in its application in the Northern Territory is modified and adapted to provide—

- (1) that the Territory shall be divided into Subdivisions, and the boundaries of each Subdivision shall be as specified by Proclamation; and
- (2) that the first Roll for the Northern Territory shall be prepared as soon as practicable after the coming into operation of the Northern Territory Electoral Regulations, and may be prepared in the manner directed by Proclamation:

And whereas the Northern Territory Electoral Regulations are now in operation:

Now therefore I, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby proclaim—

- (1) that the Northern Territory shall be divided into Subdivisions as set out in the Schedule to this Proclamation;
- (2) that the first Roll for the Northern Territory and for each Subdivision of the Northern Territory as set out in the Schedule to this Proclamation, shall forthwith be prepared by the Returning Officer for the Northern Territory in accordance with this Proclamation;
- (3) that the Returning Officer for the Northern Territory shall prepare in respect of each Subdivision a list setting out the names, addresses and occupations of all persons who to the best of his means of information are qualified to be enrolled as electors of the Territory and whose respective places of living are in that Subdivision;
- (4) that the Returning Officer shall, so far as he is reasonably able to do so, cause to be left at or sent by post to the habitation of each of the persons whose names appear on the said list a form of claim for enrolment;
- (5) that the Returning Officer shall note on the said list against the name of each person from whom the Registrar for the Subdivision receives a duly completed electoral claim and who, he is satisfied, is entitled to be enrolled for the Subdivision, the fact that a claim has been so received and the date of its receipt;

(6) that the Returning Officer shall add to the list the name of any person not already appearing thereon, from whom the Registrar for the Subdivision receives a duly completed electoral claim, and who, he is satisfied, is entitled to be enrolled for the Subdivision, and shall note against such name the fact that a claim has been so received, and the date of its receipt:

Provided that no such notation shall be made on the list relating to the Darwin Subdivision in respect of a claim received after the hour of six o'clock in the afternoon of the day immediately preceding polling day, and that no such notation shall be made on the list relating to the Batchelor Subdivision or the Alice Springs Subdivision unless the claim is received within two months after the polling day.

(7) that the Returning Officer shall delete from the list all names against which no notation has been made, and certify that the names against which a notation appears form the Roll of electors for the Subdivision;

(8) that the Roll for the Subdivision shall consist of the names in respect of which a certificate in pursuance of the provisions of the last preceding paragraph has been given by the Returning Officer, and all the Subdivision Rolls so prepared shall together form the Roll for the Territory.

THE SCHEDULE.

ELECTORAL SUBDIVISIONS OF THE NORTHERN TERRITORY.

Subdivision of Darwin.

The whole of the Hundred of Bagot including the Town of Darwin.

Subdivision of Batchelor.

Commencing at the intersection of the 129th degree of longitude (being the boundary line between the Northern Territory and the State of Western Australia) with the 20th degree of latitude; thence by that degree of longitude northerly to the sea coast; thence by the sea coast generally northerly, easterly, southerly, and south-easterly to the 138th degree of longitude (being the boundary line between the Northern Territory and

the State of Queensland); thence by that degree of longitude southerly to the 24th degree of latitude; thence by that degree of latitude westerly to the 136th degree of longitude; thence by that degree of longitude northerly to the 20th degree of latitude; thence by that degree of latitude westerly to the 135th degree of longitude; thence by that degree of longitude northerly to the 19th degree of latitude; thence by that degree of latitude westerly to the 133rd degree of longitude; thence by that degree of longitude southerly to the 20th degree of latitude; thence by that degree of latitude westerly, to the point of commencement and including the islands off the coast, but not including the Hundred of Bagot.

Subdivision of Alice Springs.

Commencing at the intersection of the 129th degree of longitude (being the boundary line between the Northern Territory and the State of Western Australia) with the 20th degree of latitude; thence by that degree of longitude southerly to the 26th degree of latitude (being the boundary line between the Northern Territory and the State of South Australia); thence by that degree of latitude easterly to the 138th degree of longitude (being the boundary line between the Northern Territory and the State of Queensland); thence by that degree of longitude northerly to the 24th degree of latitude; thence by that degree of latitude westerly to the 136th degree of longitude; thence by that degree of longitude northerly to the 20th degree of latitude; thence by that degree of latitude westerly to the 135th degree of longitude; thence by that degree of longitude northerly to the 19th degree of latitude; thence by that degree of latitude westerly to the 133rd degree of longitude; thence by that degree of longitude southerly to the 20th degree of latitude; thence by that degree of latitude westerly to the point of commencement.
