PROHIBITION OF IMPORTATION OF IRON AND STEEL
PLATE AND SHEET, GALVANIZED, WHETHER COR-
RUGATED OR NOT.

WHEREAS by the *Customs Act 1901-1930* it is enacted that all goods the importation of which may be prohibited by Proclamation are prohibited imports, and that the power of prohibiting the importation of goods shall authorize prohibition, subject to any specified condition or restriction, and that goods imported contrary to any such condition or restriction shall be prohibited imports;

And whereas it is desirable to prohibit the importation into the Commonwealth of Australia of Iron and Steel Plate and Sheet, galvanized, whether corrugated or not, unless the consent in writing of the Minister of State for Trade and Customs has first been obtained:

Now therefore I, Arthur Herbert Tennyson, Baron Somers, Administering the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby prohibit the importation into the Commonwealth of Australia of Iron and Steel Plate and Sheet, galvanized, whether corrugated or not, unless the consent in writing of the Minister of State for Trade and Customs has first been obtained.

This Proclamation may be cited as Customs Proclamation No. 195.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth, at Melbourne, this third day of October, in the year (L.S.) of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty, and in the twenty-first year of His Majesty's reign.

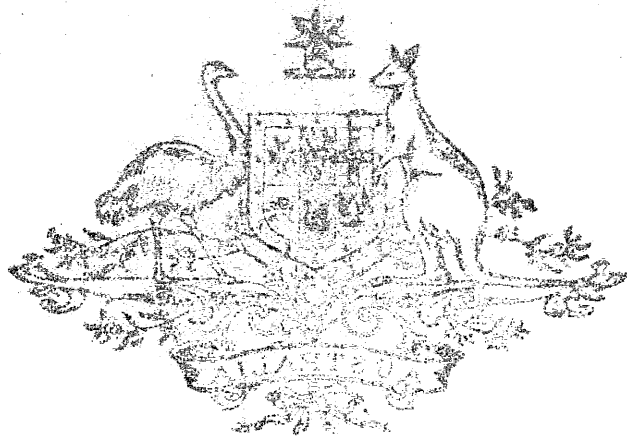
