THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

No. 4 of 1931.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Liquor Ordinance 1929-1930.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1930*, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Liquor Ordinance 1929-1931*. Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Liquor Ordinance 1929-1930* is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Liquor Ordinance 1929-1931*.

2. This Ordinance shall be deemed to have commenced on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one. Commencement.

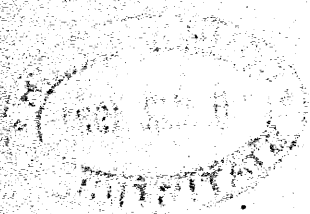
3. Section twenty-three of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting from sub-section (2.) the words "and the premises for which Café Licences may be granted shall be the premises known respectively as City Café, Kingston Café and Manuka Café". Number of café licences.

4. Section thirty-two of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting sub-section (11.) thereof. Applications for licences, &c.
