PROCLAMATION.

Commonwealth of
Australia to wit.
GOWRIE
Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-
General in and over the Com-
monwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the Imperial Act known as the *Prize Courts Act 1894*, and of certain Commissions and Warrants issued thereunder, I did, on the thirteenth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, for further assurance, proclaim that war had broken out between His Majesty the King and Germany:

And whereas a state of war now exists between His Majesty the King and Italy:

Now therefore I, Alexander Gore Arkwright, Baron Gowrie, the Governor-General aforesaid, in pursuance of the said

Imperial Act, Commissions and Warrants, being satisfied thereof by information received by me, do hereby proclaim that war has broken out between His Majesty the King and Italy.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth, this twelfth day of June, One thousand nine hundred (L.S.) and forty, and in the fourth year of His Majesty's reign.
