PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of
Australia to wit.
W. J. MCKELL
Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-
General in and over the Common-
wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by sub-section one of section seventy-six of the *Public Service Act 1922-1951* it is provided that the Governor-General may proclaim any date to be observed as a holiday in the Commonwealth Service in lieu of any of the days mentioned in the said sub-section:

And whereas it is desired that the holiday to celebrate the anniversary of the birthday of the Sovereign in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three should be observed in the Commonwealth Service in the Australian Capital Territory, the Northern Territory of Australia, and the State of Tasmania, on Tuesday, the second day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three, in lieu of Tuesday, the twenty-first day of April, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three.

Now therefore I, Sir William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby appoint Tuesday, the second day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three, to be observed as a holiday in the Commonwealth Service in the Australian Capital Territory, the Northern Territory of Australia, and the State of Tasmania, in lieu of Tuesday, the twenty-first day of April, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three.

Given under my hand and the seal of the Commonwealth this tenth day of April in the year of our Lord, One (L.S.) thousand nine hundred and fifty-three and in the second year of Her Majesty's reign.

By His Excellency the Governor-
General in and over the Common-

WHEREAS by sub-section (4.) of section 76 of the *Public Service Act 1922-1951*, it is provided that the Governor-General may, amongst other things, by proclamation at any time for any special occasion, appoint any specified day to be observed as a holiday in the public offices of the Commonwealth:

And whereas it is desired that the second day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three, should be observed as a holiday in the State of Western Australia, on the occasion of the Coronation of the Sovereign.

Now therefore I, Sir William John McKell, Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby appoint Tuesday, the second day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three, to be observed as a holiday in the Commonwealth Service in the State of Western Australia.

Given under my hand and the seal of the Commonwealth this tenth day of April in the year of our Lord, One (L.S.) thousand nine hundred and fifty-three and in the second year of Her Majesty's reign.

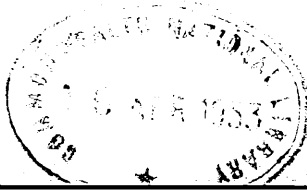

I PHILIP ALBERT MARTIN McBRIDE, Minister of State for the Interior, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section 6 of the *Bank Holidays Ordinance 1952*, hereby declare that in the year One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three the anniversary of the birthday of the Sovereign, namely, the 21st day of April, 1953, shall not be a bank holiday and I further appoint the 2nd day of June, 1953, to be a bank holiday in substitution for the said 21st day of April, 1953.
