  - for cigarettes or fine cut tobacco suitable for the manufacture of cigarettes—  
not less than 35 per cent. by weight of Australian-grown tobacco leaf;
  - for other tobacco—  
not less than 32 per cent. by weight of Australian-grown tobacco leaf.
