Customs Act 1901-1960.

NOTICE (No. 22) OF TARIFF PROPOSALS.

IN pursuance of section 273EA of the Customs Act 1901-1960, I, John Oscar Cramer, Minister of State for the Army, acting for and on behalf of the Minister of State for Customs and Excise, hereby give notice that I intend, within seven sitting days of the House of Representatives after the date of the publication of this notice in the Gazette, to propose in the Parliament—

- (a) that the Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1933-1961 be amended as set out in the Schedule to this notice; and
- (b) that the proposed Customs Tariff alteration referred to in this notice operate on and from the twenty-third day of March, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-two.
