POSTMASTER-GENERAL'S DEPARTMENT.

HIS Excellency the Governor-General in Council has, in pursuance of section 14 of the Post and Telegraph Act 1901-1961 revoked, as from the first day of April, 1962, the rates of postage in respect of postal articles posted to places outside Australia notified in the Gazette on the thirtieth day of September, 1959, in so far as those rates are in respect of:—

Letters and letter cards;
Postcards;
Commercial papers; and
Printed Matter,

addressed to places in the Republic of South Africa or in South-West Africa and approved that, on and after the first day of April, 1962, the following rates be the rates of postage in respect of those postal articles addressed to such a place:—

Letters and Letter-cards.

8d. for the first ounce or part of an ounce; and 5d. for each additional ounce or part of an ounce.

Post-cards.

8d. each.

Commercial Papers.

5d. for the first two ounces or part of two ounces; and 3d. for each additional two ounces or part of two ounces, with a minimum charge of 8d.

Printed Matter.

5d. for the first two ounces or part of two ounces; and 3d. for each additional two ounces or part of two ounces.
