## CUSTOMS (INTERMEDIATE TARIFF) ORDER No. 66.

**I** NORMAN HENRY DENHAM HENTY, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of section nine A of the Customs Tariff 1933-1961, do hereby declare that, on and after the fifth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-two, the rate of duty set out in the column headed "Intermediate Tariff" in the Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1933-1961 (being that Schedule as proposed to be amended by Customs Tariff Proposals introduced into the House of Representatives on the fourth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-two) in relation to an item in that Schedule the number of which is specified in the Schedule to this Order shall apply to goods included in that item that are the produce or manufacture of a country specified in the Second Schedule to the Customs (Intermediate Tariff) Order No. 11 made on the fourteenth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine, and published in the Gazette on the sixth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine.

## CUSTOMS TARIFF (PRIMAGE DUTIES) ORDER No. 75.

**I** NORMAN HENRY DENHAM HENTY, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the Customs Tariff (Primage Duties) 1934-1958, do hereby add, as from the fifth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-two, to the list of goods upon which primage duty at the rate of five per centum ad valorem is imposed such of the goods as are specified in the Schedule to this Order as are not, at that date—

- (i) subject to primage duty at the rate of four per centum;
- or
- (ii) exempt from primage duty.

By-law No. 717.

Item 449 (A) (1).

1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. 717.
2. By-law No. 203, published in Gazette No. 23, dated 10th March, 1961, as amended, is further amended by adding to the list of goods in Section 3 to which Tariff Item 449 (A) (1) applies, the following:—

Ammonia, aqueous, for use as a fertilizer, under security  
Ammonium bicarbonate.

By-law No. 718.

Item 449 (A) (2).

1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. 718.
2. By-law No. 204, published in Gazette No. 23, dated 10th March, 1961, as amended, is further amended by adding to the list of goods to which Tariff Item 449 (A) (2) applies, under the heading "Drugs and Chemicals, &c.", the following:—  
Urea, otherwise classifiable under Tariff Item 280 (P) or 403 (A) (1) (a), for use as a fertilizer, under security.

## QUARANTINE PROCLAMATION No. 71A.

Commonwealth of Australia to wit.  
DE L'ISLE  
Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-General  
in and over the Commonwealth of  
Australia.

WHEREAS it is provided, by sub-section (1.) of section thirteen of the Quarantine Act 1908-1961, amongst other things, that the Governor-General may, by proclamation, prohibit the importation into Australia—

- (a) of any articles likely, in his opinion, to introduce any infectious or contagious disease, or disease or pest affecting persons, animals or plants; or
- (b) of any animals or plants or any parts of animals or plants;

And whereas it is provided by sub-section (2.) of that section that the power of prohibition under that section shall extend to authorize prohibition generally or with limitations as to place and subject-matter, and either absolutely or subject to any specified conditions or restrictions:

And whereas, by Quarantine Proclamation No. 70A published in the Gazette on the twentieth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-one, the importation into Australia of certain articles (including hides and skins) was prohibited either absolutely or with limitations as to places and subject-matter or subject to specified conditions or restrictions:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke Quarantine Proclamation No. 70A in so far as it prohibits the importation into Australia of hides and skins of cattle subject to the conditions or restrictions specified in that proclamation, and to make other provision in its stead:

Now therefore, I, William Philip, Viscount De L'Isle, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council—

- (a) hereby revoke Quarantine Proclamation No. 70A in so far as it prohibits the importation of hides and skins of cattle; and
- (b) prohibit the importation of hides and skins of cattle—
  - (i) from a country other than Canada, Fiji, New Caledonia, New Hebrides, New Zealand, Norfolk Island, the Republic of Ireland, the Territory of Papua, the Territory of New Guinea, Tonga, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the United States of America or Western Samoa;
  - (ii) by aircraft; or
  - (iii) unless the importer produces to a Chief Quarantine Officer a certificate certifying that the hides or skins were obtained from cattle slaughtered in a specified country for the purpose of providing meat for human consumption, being a certificate signed by a veterinary surgeon employed by the Government of that country or by a person employed by that Government who is, in the opinion of a Chief Quarantine Officer, qualified to give the certificate.

Given under my Hand and the Great Seal of the Commonwealth this sixth day of April, in the year of our Lord, (L.S.) One thousand nine hundred and sixty-two, and in the eleventh year of Her Majesty's reign.
