WHEREAS it is provided by section twelve of the Quarantine Act 1908-1961 that the Governor-General may, by proclamation, declare that any place beyond or in Australia is infected with a quarantinable disease, or that a quarantinable disease may be brought or carried from or through that place, and thereupon, and so long as the proclamation remains in force, that place shall be a proclaimed place within the meaning of that Act:

And whereas it is provided by section five of the Quarantine Act 1908-1961 that, in that Act, unless the contrary intention appears, "quarantinable disease" means, among other diseases, cholera:

Now therefore I, William Philip, Viscount De L'Isle, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby declare that cholera may be brought or carried from or through any of the following places, that is to say—

- (a) the Colony of Hong Kong;
- (b) the Republic of Indonesia; and
- (c) the Republic of the Philippines.

Given under my Hand and the Great Seal of the Commonwealth this twenty-second day of October in the year of our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-two, and in the eleventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

  - (g) axle systems include axles, hubs including spoke spiders where necessary, brake drums, brake backing plates and brake parts mounted thereon and housed within the brake drum or directly mounted on the axle, stubs or spindles, but do not include wheels.

- (b) adding to the list of goods included in the Table to paragraph 3, the following:—

axle systems (other than steering or driving axles) having a rated load capacity of not less than 12,000 lb.

  - (b) adding to the list of goods included in the Table to paragraph 3, under the heading "when imported separately or otherwise", the following:—
    - axle systems (other than steering or driving axles) having a rated load capacity of not less than 12,000 lb.

- (i) James Gordon Tod, of 122 Tourist-road, Toowoomba, in the State of Queensland, wheat-grower, and Clement Ian Brimblecombe, of 28 Drummond-street, Toowoomba, in the State of Queensland, wheat-grower, who are members of and nominated by the State Wheat Board of Queensland, as the members representing wheat-growers in that State.
