## NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PROPOSE CUSTOMS TARIFF ALTERATION

NOTICE NO. 1 (1969)

IN pursuance of section 273EA of the Customs Act 1901–1968, I, MALCOLM FOX SCOTT, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, hereby give notice that it is intended, within seven sitting days of the House of Representatives after the date of the publication of this notice in the Gazette, to propose in the Parliament a Customs Tariff alteration in accordance with the particulars specified in the Schedule to this notice and operating on and from the tenth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-nine.

### THE SCHEDULE

#### AMENDMENTS OF PART II. OF THE FIRST SCHEDULE TO THE CUSTOMS TARIFF 1966–1968

1. Omit note 12 to Chapter 40.
2. Omit sub-item 40.12.2, insert the following sub-item:—  

“ 40.12.2		– Hot water bags	.. .. .	..   45%	35%”.
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3. Omit note 9 to Chapter 90, insert the following note:—  

“ 9. The following components are specified for the purposes of sub-item 90.20.2 and for purposes of item 1656 in Part V. of the Fifth Schedule:—

  - (a) X-ray tubes;
  - (b) tube shields;
  - (c) bucky fluoroscopic grids;
  - (d) fluorescent screens;
  - (e) intensifying screens;
  - (f) lead glass protective screens;
  - (g) eye localisers;
  - (h) tube holders of the shock-proof type as used in deep therapy units ”.

4. Omit item 90.20, insert the following item:—

“ 90.20	* Apparatus based on the use of X-rays or of the radiations from radioactive substances (including radiography and radiotherapy apparatus); X-ray generators; X-ray tubes; X-ray screens; X-ray high tension generators; X-ray control panels and desks; X-ray examination or treatment tables, chairs and the like:

## SECOND SCHEDULE

## By-laws Nos S1006 to S1007

I, MALCOLM FOX SCOTT, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI. of the Customs Act 1901-1968, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the by-laws set out in the Schedule hereto.

## THE SCHEDULE

Second Schedule

1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. S1006.

2. This by-law shall take effect on and from 10 January 1969.

3. Customs By-law No. S8 published in Gazette No. 17 dated 18 February 1966, is amended as follows:

Omit:

- 'Item 90.20 Apparatus, X-ray, to which sub-item 90.20.4 or sub-paragraph 90.20.911 in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1968 applies, the following:
  - X-ray Bucky diaphragms
  - X-ray grids
- Item 90.20 Control units, fluorographic, excluding wall switches, of a kind used in connection with X-ray equipment
- Item 90.20 Instruments and apparatus for measuring the density of liquids, solids and gases
- Item 92.10 Mutes, violin

- Item 92.10 Rests, chin, violin  
 Item 92.10 Rests, shoulder, violin  
 Item 92.10 Timber, cut into shape, dressed or partly dressed, for violins.'

By-law No. S1007

Item No. 19  
 Second Schedule

1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. S1007.
2. This by-law shall take effect on and from 10 January 1969.
3. Unless the context otherwise requires in this by-law in ascertaining whether goods fall within the terms of a reference or whether a reference applies to goods, regard shall be had to:
  - (a) the Rules for the Interpretation of the First Schedule set out in Part I. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1968; and
  - (b) the notes to a Division of Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1968 or to a Chapter of such a Division that has application to the goods under their Tariff classification in Part II. of that First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1968.
4. Item 19 in Part I. of the Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1968, applies to goods described in the second column of the Table hereunder that are goods to which the item in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1968, listed in the first column of that Table opposite those goods, applies.
