NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PROPOSE CUSTOMS TARIFF ALTERATION

NOTICE No. 6 (1969)

IN pursuance of section 273EA of the Customs Act 1901-1968, I, MALCOLM FOX SCOTT, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, hereby give notice that it is intended, within seven sitting days of the House of Representatives after the date of the publication of this notice in the Gazette, to propose in the Parliament a Customs Tariff alteration in accordance with the particulars specified in the Schedule to this notice and operating on and from the fourteenth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-nine.

THE SCHEDULE

AMENDMENTS OF PART II. OF THE FIRST SCHEDULE TO THE CUSTOMS TARIFF 1966-1969.

1. After note 4 to Chapter 20 insert the following note:—

“5. The following goods are specified for the purposes of sub-item 20.04.3, that is to say, goods that—

- (a) were in transit to Australia on 4 June, 1969; and
- (b) are entered for home consumption within 21 days after importation.”.

2. After sub-item 20.04.2 insert the following sub-item:—

“ 20.04.3	- Cherries	47½%, and, except in respect of goods specified in note 5 to this Chapter, a temporary duty of \$0.06 per lb	22½%, and, except in respect of goods specified in note 5 to this Chapter, a temporary duty of \$0.06 per lb”.

THE SCHEDULE

AMENDMENTS OF PART II. OF THE FIRST SCHEDULE TO THE CUSTOMS TARIFF 1966-1969.

1. After note 3 to Chapter 85 insert the following note:—

“4. In paragraphs 85.19.21 and 85.19.22 “each ancillary article” means each article, including each control panel, transformer or switch, that, in the opinion of the Minister, is separate from, or is capable of being readily separated from, a circuit breaker being switchgear or forming part of switchgear”.

2. Omit paragraphs 85.19.21 and 85.19.22, insert the following paragraphs:—

“ 85.19.21	-- Switchgear of a kind rated for use on nominal system voltages exceeding 200 kV	In respect of each ancillary article—the rate of duty set out in this column that would apply to the goods if they were imported separately; In respect of the remainder of the goods—7½%	In respect of each ancillary article—the rate of duty that would apply to the goods if they were imported separately; In respect of the remainder of the goods—Free
85.19.22	-- Switchgear of a kind rated for use at voltages exceeding 1,000 and not falling within paragraph 85.19.21	In respect of each ancillary article—the rate of duty set out in this column that would apply to the goods if they were imported separately; In respect of the remainder of the goods—45%	In respect of each ancillary article—the rate of duty that would apply to the goods if they were imported separately; In respect of the remainder of the goods—35%”.

CUSTOMS TARIFF 1966-1969**SECOND SCHEDULE****By-law No. S1075**

I, MALCOLM FOX SCOTT, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI. of the Customs Act 1901-1968, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the following by-law:

By-law No. S1075

Item No. 19
Second Schedule

1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. S1075.
2. This by-law shall take effect on and from 14 July 1969.
3. Customs By-law No. S8, published in Gazette No. 17 dated 18 February 1966 is amended as follows:

Omit:

- 'Item 85.19 Circuit breakers, air-break, for use at voltages exceeding 1,000
- Item 85.19 Reclosers, circuit, automatic series (current) operated, with normal current carrying capacity of up to 200 amps, one, two and three phase, rated at voltages up to and including 25,000 volts and at maximum rated interrupting capacities not exceeding 4,000 amps per phase'.
