PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit.
PAUL HASLUCK

By His Excellency the Governor-General
in and over the Commonwealth of
Australia.

WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section (2.) of section 2 of the Patents Act 1969 that the provisions of that Act referred to in that sub-section shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by Proclamation:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable that those provisions of that Act should come into operation on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and seventy:

NOW THEREFORE I, Sir Paul Meernaa Caedwalla Hasluck, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby fix the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and seventy, as the date on which the provisions of the Patents Act 1969 referred to in sub-section (2.) of section 2 of that Act shall come into operation.

GIVEN under my hand and the Great Seal of the Commonwealth this twenty-fifth day of September in the year of (L.S.) Our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-nine, and in the eighteenth year of Her Majesty's reign.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 2 of the Customs Act (No. 2) 1968 that sections 1, 2, 31 and 37 of that Act shall come into operation on the day on which that Act receives the Royal Assent, that sections 29 and 30 of that Act shall be deemed to have come into operation on the eighteenth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-eight, and that the remaining provisions of that Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by Proclamation:

NOW THEREFORE I, Sir Paul Meernaa Caedwalla Hasluck, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, fix the first day of October, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-nine, as the day on which the provisions of that Act, other than sections 1, 2, 29, 30, 31 and 37, shall come into operation.
