CUSTOMS TARIFF 1966-1969

SECTION 24

Parts Direction No. 3 (1969)

I. MALCOLM FOX SCOTT, Minister of State for Customs and Excise in pursuance of sub-section (1) of Section 24 of the Customs Tariff 1966-1969 direct that the rate of duty specified in column 2 of the Schedule to this Direction applies for the purposes of sub-section (2) of that section, in relation to the class of goods specified in column 1 of that Schedule opposite that rate of duty.

2. In this direction 'First Schedule' means Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969.

3. This direction may be cited as Parts Direction No. 3 (1969) and, subject to the next succeeding paragraphs, shall take effect on and from the tenth day of November 1969.

4. This direction shall not apply to goods that are:

- (a) on firm order overseas on or before the seventh day of November 1969, and are entered for home consumption on or before the thirtieth day of December 1969; or
- (b) in bond in Australia on the seventh day of November 1969 and are entered for home consumption on or before the fifth day of December 1969.

5. Except in respect of goods specified in the last preceding paragraph Parts Direction No. 1 (1968) published in Gazette No. 95 of 14 November 1968 shall cease to have effect after the seventh day of November 1969.

6. Part I. of the Schedule hereunder applies to parts on which duty is ascertained by application of Section 16 of the Customs Tariff 1966-1969.

7. Part II. of the Schedule hereunder applies to parts on which duty is ascertained by application of Section 17 of the Customs Tariff 1966-1969.

SECTION 23

Substitutes and Imitations Notice No. 20

I, MALCOLM FOX SCOTT, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Section 23 of the Customs Tariff 1966-1969 and all other enabling powers:

- (a) declare that I am of the opinion that goods of a kind specified in the first column of the table hereunder:
 - (i) are a substitute for goods of another kind specified in the second column of that table opposite those goods;
 - (ii) are intended to be or can be used as a substitute for goods of another kind specified in the second column of that table opposite those goods;
 - (iii) can be used for any purpose for which goods of another kind specified in the second column of that table opposite those goods can be used; or
 - (iv) are an imitation of goods of another kind specified in the second column of that table opposite those goods; and
- (b) direct that the duty in respect of goods specified in the first column of the table hereunder is the duty that would be applicable in respect of them, if they were goods of the kind specified in the second column of that table opposite those goods.

2. In this notice "First Schedule" means the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969.

3. Unless the context otherwise requires in this notice in ascertaining whether goods fall within the terms of a reference or whether a reference applies to goods, regard shall be had to:

- (a) the Rules for the Interpretation of the First Schedule set out in Part I. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969; and
- (b) the notes to a Division of Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969 or to a Chapter of such a Division that has application to the goods under their Tariff classification in Part II. of that First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969.

4. This notice may be cited as Substitutes and Imitations Notice No. 20 and shall take effect on and after the tenth day of November 1969.

5. Substitutes and Imitations Notice No. 15, published in Gazette No. 77 of 22 September 1969 is revoked.

CUSTOMS TARIFF 1966-1969**SEPARATE ARTICLES DIRECTION No. 26**

I, MALCOLM FOX SCOTT, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of section 25 of the Customs Tariff 1966-1969, direct that the duty in respect of goods, being goods that consist of or are capable of being separated into separate articles, included in a class of goods specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Direction shall be such duty as would be payable if:

- (a) each of the articles specified in the second column of that Schedule and opposite those goods or that class of goods; and
 (b) the remainder of the goods, if any,

had been imported separately.

In this direction "First Schedule" means Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969.

This Direction has effect from and including the tenth day of November 1969.

PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of

WHEREAS by the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia it is amongst other things provided that the Governor-General may appoint such times for holding the sessions of the Parliament as he thinks fit:

Now therefore I, Sir Paul Meernaa Caedwalla Hasluck, the Governor-General aforesaid, in the exercise of the power conferred by the Constitution, do by this my Proclamation appoint Tuesday, the twenty-fifth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-nine, as the day for the Parliament to assemble and be holden for the despatch of divers urgent and important affairs: and all Senators and Members of the House of Representatives are hereby required to give their attendance accordingly in the building known as Parliament House, Canberra, at the hour of eleven o'clock in the morning on the twenty-fifth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-nine.

GIVEN under my Hand this twelfth day of November in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and sixty-nine, and in the eighteenth year of Her Majesty's reign.
