IMPORTATION OF SUGAR.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Sir Ronald Craufurd Munro Ferguson, a Member of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Customs Act* 1901-1914 it is enacted that all goods the importation of which may be prohibited by proclamation are prohibited imports:

And whereas it is desirable, in the interests of the public welfare, to prohibit the importation of sugar, except with the consent in writing of the Minister of State for Trade and Customs:

Now therefore I, Sir Ronald Craufurd Munro Ferguson, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby prohibit the importation of sugar into the Commonwealth of Australia, except with the consent in writing of the Minister of State for Trade and Customs.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth at Adelaide, this seventh day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and in the sixth year of His Majesty's reign.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Sir Ronald Craufurd Munro Ferguson, a Member of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Commonwealth of Australia.

And whereas it is desirable, in the interests of the public health and welfare, to prohibit the importation of certain appliances:

Now therefore I, Sir Ronald Craufurd Munro Ferguson, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the importation into the Commonwealth of the undermentioned appliance, whether described by the name specified or by any other name, shall be prohibited:—

The appliance now described and known as "The Galvo Filter and Water Steriliser."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth at Adelaide, this seventh day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and in the sixth year of His Majesty's reign.
