### WAR PRECAUTIONS (PRICES) REGULATIONS 1916.

#### DETERMINATION OF MAXIMUM PRICES.

Melbourne, 17th August, 1916.

I, GEORGE FOSTER PEARCE, Minister of State for Defence, in pursuance of the War Precautions (Prices) Regulations 1916 (Statutory Rules 1916, No. 155, as amended by Statutory Rules 1916, No. 188), and on the recommendation of the Commissioner for the State of Queensland, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Order No. 16, and shall come into force on the 21st August, 1916.
2. This Order shall apply to the areas in the State of Queensland specified in the Schedule to this Order.
3. This Order supersedes so much of the Twenty-sixth Order under "The Control of Trade Act of 1914" of the State of Queensland, made on the 27th day of August, 1915, as relates to the price of Cheese, and the Fifty-third Order under "The Control of Trade Act of 1914" of the State of Queensland, made on the 20th day of June, 1916.
4. The maximum prices which may be charged for cheese excepting fancy cheese in the proclaimed areas to which this Order applies shall until further Order be as set out in the Schedule to this Order.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Order No. 18, and shall come into force on the 21st August, 1916.
2. This Order shall apply to the areas in the State of Western Australia specified in the Schedule to this Order.
3. Section (A) of the Schedule to Prices Order No. 9, made on the 9th August, 1916, is hereby repealed.

## DETERMINATION OF MAXIMUM PRICES.

Melbourne, 17th August, 1916.

I, GEORGE FOSTER PEARCE, Minister of State for Defence, in pursuance of the War Precautions (Prices) Regulations 1916 (Statutory Rules 1916, No. 155, as amended by Statutory Rules 1916, No. 188), and on the recommendation of the Commissioner for Victoria, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Order No. 19, and shall come into force on the 21st August, 1916.
2. This Order shall apply to each proclaimed area in the State of Victoria.
3. The maximum prices (wholesale and retail) which may be charged in any proclaimed area in the State of Victoria for sweetened condensed milk shall, until further Order, be the prices generally prevailing in that area on the 1st July, 1916.

3. So much of Prices Order No. 8, made on the 10th August, 1916, as relates to the price of self-raising flour in areas in the State of Queensland is hereby repealed.
4. The maximum prices which may be charged for self-raising flour in the proclaimed areas in the State of Queensland shall be as set out in the Schedule to this Order.
