WHEREAS by the Customs Act 1901-1916 it is enacted that all goods the importation of which may be prohibited by Proclamation are prohibited imports:

And whereas it is desirable to prohibit the importation into the Commonwealth of tinplates and terneplates other than those manufactured in the United Kingdom or in the British Possessions, unless the consent in writing of the Minister of State for Defence has first been obtained:

Now therefore I, Sir Ronald Craufurd Munro Ferguson, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby prohibit the importation into the Commonwealth of Australia of tinplates and terne-plates other than those manufactured in the United Kingdom or in the British Possessions, unless the consent in writing of the Minister of State for Defence has first been obtained.



COMMONWEALTH PUBLIC SERVICE.

FOR APPOINTMENT AS FEMALE TYPIST (GENERAL DIVISION), LISMORE, NEW SOUTH WALES (One Vacancy).

A COMPETITIVE Examination for appointment as above will be held at Lismore on Saturday afternoon, 27th January, 1917.

Persons Eligible to Enter.—The Examination will be open to (a) females (unmarried) from outside the Commonwealth Public Service who, at the date of examination, will have attained their sixteenth birthday, but not their twenty-sixth birthday, and who are natural-born or naturalized British subjects; and (b) female officers of the Commonwealth Public Service in New South Wales, irrespective of age.

Applications Close.—Applications must be forwarded to the Secretary to the Commonwealth Public Service Commissioner, Melbourne, and must be lodged not later than 4th January, 1917.

Should an intending candidate be unable to lodge her application by the date named she should notify her candidature by telegram, at the same time forwarding her written application and entrance fee.

How to Make Application.—The applications of persons from outside the Service must be submitted on printed forms, which may be obtained, upon either written or personal request, from the Postmaster at Lismore.

A candidate from within the Service should submit her application on foolscap, and indicate in which Department and in what capacity she is employed.

Examination Fee.—Each application must be accompanied by a postal note for 7s. 6d., crossed and made payable to the Secretary to the Commonwealth Public Service Commissioner, Melbourne.

A candidate who is on the Permanent Staff of the Commonwealth Public Service will be exempt from payment of entrance fee if, as an officer of the Service, she has paid a fee of not less than 7s. 6d. at an examination under the Commonwealth Public Service Act and Regulations, at which she was not successful; but if at the last examination for which she entered, and at which a fee was payable, she was admitted without payment of fee, she will be required to lodge a fee of 7s. 6d. with her application.

An officer who claims to be exempt from payment of fee should indicate in her application (a) the number of the examination for which she entered and paid a fee; (b) the year in which it was held; and (c) the position for which she competed.

Salary.—The annual salary attached to the position is —Minimum £78; maximum £162. The minimum salary will be paid to all appointees under the age of 21 years. Appointees 21 years of age and upwards will receive £132 per annum, which rate will also be paid to other appointees upon their reaching that age. Appointees will advance from their commencing salary to £162 per annum by annual increments, granted subject to good conduct, diligence, and efficiency. Appointees will rank junior to officers of the Service in corresponding positions who are in receipt of salary of £78 per annum.

A successful candidate from within the Service will be transferred as Typist at her present salary, provided that no such transfer will be effected at a salary less than £78 per annum.

Cost of Conveyance to Place of Appointment.—A refund will be made of any expense in excess of £3 incurred by a successful candidate for conveyance to her place of appointment, upon application being made by her for such refund after taking up duty.

Period of Eligibility.—Successful candidates will be cligible for appointment during the period of eighteen months following the publication in the Commonwealth Gazette of the results of the Examination, but if, before the expiration of such period, a successful examinee from outside the Service attains her twenty-sixth birthday, she will thereupon cease to be eligible for appointment.

Appointment Subject to Conditions.—Upon appointment, a successful candidate from outside the Service must produce evidence of the date of her birth and a medical certificate satisfying the Commissioner in such particulars as he may determine, as to sound bodily health and freedom from physical defects. A successful candidate should not undergo medical examination until instructed by the Commissioner to do so. An appointee will also be required to assure her life in accordance with the Regulations.

Refusal of Appointment.—If a successful candidate decline to accept an appointment offered to her, or fail to reply within seven days to a communication from the Commissioner or a Public Service Inspector respecting her nomination to the Public Service, her name may be removed from the "Register of Qualified Candidates."

If the applicant is an officer of the Commonwealth Public Service the application should be forwarded to the Inspector through the principal officer of the Department in the State in which the officer is located, except when the vacancy is in another State, when the application should be forwarded direct by the applicant to the Inspector, a copy at the same time being forwarded to the principal officer of the Department.

Minimum and maximum salaries where shown indicate the limits of the class or grade in which the position is classified. Subject to the provisions of the Public Service Act appointments may be made at any salary within those limits. Officers who may be transferred without promotion or increase of salary, as the result of an application for an advertised vacancy, will be required to pay their own expenses of removal unless the transfer comes within the conditions prescribed in Public Service Regulation No. 54.
