LICENCE

Commonwealth of Australia to wit.

R. M. FERGUSON. Governor-General. By His Excellency the Right Honorable Sir Ronald Craufurd Munro Ferguson, a Member of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor-General and Commander-Governor-General and Commander in-Chief of the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation relating to Trading with the Enemy, issued by His Majesty the King in Council on the ninth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and published in the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette of the twelfth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, it is amongst other things declared that nothing in that Proclamation shall be taken to prohibit anything which shall be expressly permitted by licence given by His Majesty or by the licence given on behalf of His Majesty by a Secretary of State or the Board of Trade whether such licences be especially granted to individuals or be announced as applying to classes of persons:

And whereas by a further Proclamation issued by His Majesty the King in Council on the eighth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and published in the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette on the twelfth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, it is amongst other things provided that the power to grant licences on behalf of His Majesty vested by the first-recited Proclamation in a Secretary of State may be exercised in Australia by the Governor-General:

And whereas the Union Bank of Australia Limited And whereas the Union Bank of Australia Limited has in its possession holding orders in the name of the said Bank for certain concentrates the property of Aron Hirsch & Sohn which are stored on certain wharfs in South Australia which orders are held by the said bank as security for an overdraft on an account called the F. H. Snow Ore Account:

And whereas the said bank has issued a writ against the said Francis Hugh Snow in respect of the overdraft on the said account and accruing interest thereon:

Now therefore, I, Sir Ronald Craufurd Munro Ferguson, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby permit the Union Bank of Australia Limited and Francis Hugh Snow and each of them to communicate with the agents and attorneys in New York, United

States of America, of Aron Hirsch & Sohn, of Halber-stadt, Germany and to procure them to pay or secure or otherwise agree with the bank in respect of the moneys claimed by the bank from the said Francis Hugh Snow:

And I declare that it is a condition of this licence that before any arrangement is made by the said bank and/or the said Francis Hugh Snow with any person in relation to the said concentrates the full details of the proposed arrangement shall be submitted to and approved by the Attorney-General of the Commonwealth:

And I further declare that the issue of this licence is not to be construed as authorizing the shipment of the said concentrates from Australia, or as giving any person any claim to receive permission to ship the said concentrates from Australia, either during the continuance of the war or at any time after its termination.

WHEREAS by the War Precautions Act 1914-1915 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor-General may, by Order published in the Gazette, make provision for any matters which appear necessary or expedient with a view to the public safety and the defence of the Commonwealth, and in particular for requiring any person to disclose any information in his possession as to any matter specified in the Order, and for appointing officers to carry the Order into effect, and for conferring on such officers and on the Minister such powers as are necessary or expedient for the purposes of the Order, and for conferring on such persons

as are specified in the Order such powers with respect to the administration of oaths, arrest, detention, search of premises and persons, inspecting, impounding, or retention of books, documents, and papers, and other-wise, as are specified in the Order:

And whereas it appears expedient to make provision for the undermentioned matters in the manner herein-after appearing.

Now therefore I, Sir Ronald Craufurd Munro Ferguson, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby provide as follows:

1. This Order shall apply to an inquiry with respect to the prices charged to the Department of Defence by contractors and others for medical

2. I appoint Colonel James Byres Laing, an officer of the Commonwealth Audit Office, to be the authorized officer for the purpose of this Order, and I require him to furnish to the Minister of State for Defence a report on the inquire inquiry.
3. I confer on the authorized officer the power-

er on the authorized officer the power—

(a) to hold an inquiry at such time and place as he deems desirable in relation to the subject of the inquiry;

(b) to require the attendance at the inquiry of persons as witnesses;

(c) to examine witnesses upon oath or affirmation, and to reduce to writing any answers made by a witness;

(d) to require of any person the production of any documents, books, or papers relating to the inquiry; and

(e) to examine all documents produced to him as official documents, and if he sees fit, to admit them in evidence without requiring formal proof of their authenticity. their authenticity

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Sir Ronald Craufurd Munro Ferguson, a Member of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Spint George Council Commonwealth of Australia to wit. R. M. FERGUSON.

HEREAS by the Quarantine Act 1908-1915 it is enacted that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, prohibit the importation into Australia of any animals or plants, or any parts of animals or plants, and that the power of prohibition shall extend to authorize prohibition generally, or with limitations as to place and subject-matter, and either absolutely or subject to any specified conditions or restriction:

And whereas by a Proclamation published in the Gazette of 26th June, 1915, the importation into Australia of Citrus plants (except Citrus fruits) was pro-

And whereas it is desirable to modify the said Proclamation :

Now therefore I, Sir Ronald Craufurd Munro Ferguson, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby repeal the said Proclamation, and I do hereby prohibit the importation into Australia of Citrus plants from any part of the world; provided that Citrus fruits may be imported from any country in which the disease Citrus Canker or Japanese Canker does not exist:

The term "Citrus" as used herein shall be understood include all plants belonging to the sub-family or tribe Citratæ:
