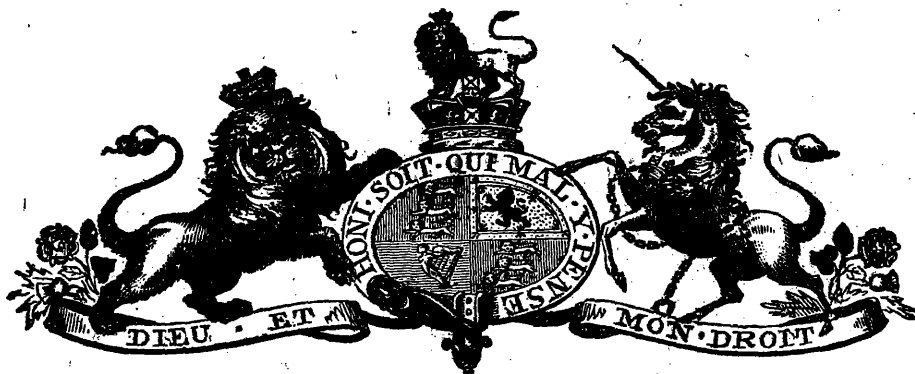

WAR PRECAUTIONS (COAL) REGULATIONS.

I JOSEPH COOK, Minister of State for the Navy, in pursuance of the War Precautions (Coal) Regulations (Statutory Rules 1917, No. 195, as amended by Statutory Rules 1917, Nos. 240 and 252, and Statutory Rules 1919, Nos. 103, 119, 141, 147, 182, and 183), and on the recommendation of the Central Coal Board, do hereby order as follows:—

Use and Consumption of Gas and Electric Current in the State of South Australia.

1. The use and consumption of electric current for lighting and cooking in private houses, boarding-houses, hotels, and restaurants is prohibited except between the hours of 5 a.m. and 8.30 a.m., and between the hours of 5 p.m. and 10.30 p.m. on week days (Mondays to Saturdays inclusive), and between the hours of 5 a.m. and 2 p.m., and between the hours of 5 p.m. and 10.30 p.m. on Sundays.
2. The use of electric current at any time for heating purposes other than cooking in private houses, boarding-houses, hotels, and restaurants is prohibited.
3. The use and consumption of gas for lighting and cooking in private houses, boarding-houses, hotels, and restaurants is prohibited except between the hours of 5 a.m. and 8.30 a.m., and between the hours of 5 p.m. and 7.30 p.m. on week days (Mondays to Saturdays inclusive), and between the hours of 5 a.m. and 2 p.m., and between the hours of 5 p.m. and 7.30 p.m. on Sundays.
4. The use of gas at any time for heating purposes other than cooking in private houses, boarding houses, hotels, and restaurants is prohibited.
5. The use and consumption, by any person, of electric current or gas for lighting purposes, at any time, in any street or position external to a building, or in any shop window, is

prohibited: Provided that this Order shall not apply to electric light or gas light provided by a local authority or other public body for street lighting.

6. The use and consumption by any person of electric current or gas for lighting any office, factory, workshop, retail shop, or other building, or portion of a building (other than private houses, boarding houses, hotels, and restaurants) is prohibited on each day except between the hours of 5 p.m. and the usual time of closing (in any case not later than 10.30 p.m.).

7. This order shall take effect on and after Tuesday, 10th day of February, 1920.

WAR PRECAUTIONS (COAL) REGULATIONS.

Coal Stocks in Western Australia.

Any person, firm, or company, and any authority constituted under the Commonwealth or any State, possessing in the State of Western Australia, whether for industrial purposes or not, more than 5 tons of coke or New South Wales coal shall, not later than Saturday, 14th February, 1920, submit to the District Naval Officer, Naval Staff Office, Fremantle, a return verified by statutory declaration setting forth the quantity and nature of the coal or coke possessed by him or it at Noon on Thursday, 12th February, 1920, and the place at which such coke or coal is stored.
