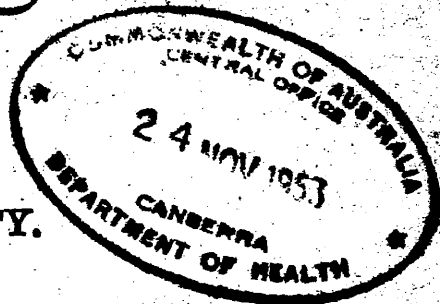

PROCLAMATION

Australia to wit.
FORSTER,
Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-
General of the Commonwealth
of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Northern Territory Acceptance Act* 1910 any power vested by an Act of the State of South Australia continued in force in the Northern Territory in the Governor is vested in the Governor-General:

And whereas by the *Northern Territory Crown Lands Act* 1890 (an Act of the State of South Australia continued in force in the Northern Territory) the Governor may by Proclamation dedicate any Crown lands for any purpose of public utility, safety, convenience, health, or enjoyment:

And whereas it is desirable to dedicate the Crown lands described in Schedule hereto for the use and benefit of the inhabitants of the Town of Darwin.

Now therefore I, Henry William, Baron Forster, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby dedicate the Crown lands described in Schedule hereto for the use and benefit of the inhabitants of the Town of Darwin.

SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

That area of Crown lands in the Town of Darwin, Hundred of Bagot, county of Palmerston, bounded on the north-east by the south-western side of Mitchell-street south-west of sections 576, 577, 578, 579, 580, and 581, on the south-east by a straight line one chain north-west from and parallel to the north-western boundary of sections 614 and 677 and that line produced south-westerly to the sea coast, on the south-west by the sea coast, and on the north-west by a straight line, being the south-eastern side of Packard-street south-east of sections 613, 678, 709, and 710 and that line produced south-westerly to the north-eastern boundary of freehold section 829, excepting that area dedicated for hospital purposes by Proclamation dated the 13th day of June, 1912, and that area at Peel's Well dedicated as a Water Reserve and placed under the care, control, and management of the District Council, at Palmerston, by Proclamation dated the 18th day of April, 1877.

AN ORDINANCE

Relating to the Examination of Engine-drivers.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Northern Territory Acceptance Act 1910-1919* and the *Northern Territory (Administration) Act 1910*, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Examination of Engine-drivers Ordinance 1920*.

2. Sections one hundred and twenty-six to one hundred and twenty-nine of Act No. 839 of the State of South Australia intituled "*The Northern Territory Mining Act, 1903*" shall cease to apply to the Northern Territory.

3. In this Ordinance, unless the contrary intention appears—

"Boiler" means any closed vessel which is, or is intended to be, used under internal pressure from steam, air or gas, and includes digesters, pipes under steam or gas pressure, gas cylinders for aerated water factories, air receivers, steam-jacketed pans, montyjus digesters, retorts other than retorts used for retorting mercury from gold or silver amalgam, and all settings, fittings, mountings, feed pumps, injectors, and other equipment necessary for the efficiency of the boiler;

"Certificate" means an engine-driver's certificate;

"Engine" means any piece of mechanism used to convert heat or some other form of energy into mechanical work or any machine for the development of power from some source of energy such as coal, gas, oil, compressed air or other source, but does not include a railway locomotive engine;

"Machinery" means every kind of mechanical appliance, and includes boilers, air receivers, steam-pipes, air-pipes, electric wires, cables, belts, and ropes employed in or about a mine;

"Mine" means a place where any operation for the purpose of obtaining metal or minerals has been or is being carried on, or where the products of any such place have been or are being treated or dealt with.

Board of
Examiners.

4.—(1.) The Administrator may from time to time appoint a Board of Examiners, consisting of at least two members, to examine candidates for certificates.

(2.) The Administrator may appoint one of the members of the Board to be Chairman of the Board.

Power of
Board to
grant
certificates.

5.—(1.) Subject to this Ordinance, the Board shall have power to grant, to a candidate who satisfies the Board that he possesses the necessary knowledge, skill and experience, and is not otherwise unfit, such of the following certificates as the Board considers proper:—

- (a) First class certificate;
- (b) Second class certificate; or
- (c) Third class certificate.

(2.) A certificate, signed by the Chairman of the Board shall, in the absence of proof to the contrary, be deemed to have been granted by the Board.

Certificate
granted

6. Subject to this Ordinance, a certificate shall only be granted by the Board after examination as prescribed.

7.—(1.) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Ordinance the Board may, if it thinks fit, without examination, grant a certificate of competency under this Ordinance to any candidate who has been granted a certificate under the laws of a State or under any law in force in the Northern Territory prior to the commencement of this Ordinance.

Certificates granted without examination in certain cases.

(2.) A certificate of competency, signed by the Chairman of the Board shall, in the absence of proof to the contrary, be deemed to have been granted by the Board.

8. The Board shall hold such examinations as are prescribed and for the purpose of satisfying itself that a candidate for a certificate possesses the necessary knowledge, skill and experience, may require the candidate to produce such evidence as the Board thinks necessary or as is prescribed.

Board to hold examinations.

9. Subject to this Ordinance and any Regulations made thereunder, all such examinations shall be held at such times and places as are notified by the Board in the *Gazette*.

Time and place of examinations to be notified.

10. All examinations held under this Ordinance shall be conducted in accordance with such rules as are prescribed.

Conduct of examinations.

11.—(1.) No person may apply for examination for a First Class Certificate unless—

Qualifications required of applicants for First Class Certificates.

- (a) he has held a Second Class Certificate for at least twelve months ;
- (b) he furnishes satisfactory evidence that since the issue of the Second Class Certificate he has had charge of engines, of which the holder of a Second Class Certificate, but not the holder of a Third Class Certificate, may be in charge ; and
- (c) he furnishes satisfactory evidence that during the twelve months immediately preceding his application he has, for at least twelve hours per week for six months, been instructed, by an engine-driver holding a First Class Certificate, in the driving of engines used for winding in vertical shafts.

(2.) For the purposes of paragraph (c) of the last preceding subsection, the certificate (in the prescribed form and containing the prescribed particulars) of the Manager of the mine at which the applicant was employed and of the engine-driver by whom the applicant was instructed as to the extent of his experience at the mine shall be deemed to be satisfactory evidence for the purposes of that paragraph.

12. No person may apply for examination for a Second Class Certificate unless—

Qualifications of applicants for Second Class Certificates.

- (a) he has had a Third Class Certificate for at least twelve months ;
- (b) he furnishes satisfactory evidence that since the issue of the Third Class Certificate he has, for not less than twelve hours per week for at least six months, had experience in driving a third class mining engine.

13. A candidate for examination for a Third Class Certificate shall satisfy the Board—

Qualifications of applicants for Third Class Certificates.

- (a) that within a period of three years immediately prior to the date of examination he has, during not less than twelve months and for not less than twelve hours per week, been actually employed, under a certificated engine-driver, in assisting to drive a steam-engine with a boiler and accessories connected therewith and used for mining, factory or other purposes ;

- (b) that he is at the date of the examination, not under the age of eighteen years nor over the age of fifty years: Provided that a candidate who satisfies the Board that the necessary experience has been gained prior to his attaining the age of fifty years may, in the discretion of the Board, be considered eligible for examination;
- (c) of his respectability of character; and
- (d) that he has reached the prescribed standard of education and general proficiency.

Medical certificate to be furnished with application for certificate.

14. Every candidate for a certificate shall forward with his application a certificate, in accordance with the Form in the First Schedule to this Ordinance, signed by a medical practitioner, that he is not wholly or partially deaf, nor has defective eyesight, nor is subject to fits, giddiness or any other infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of the duties of an engine-driver.

Fee for medical certificate.

15. The fee payable to a medical practitioner for any such certificate and the examination necessary for the giving of any such certificate shall not exceed Ten shillings.

Class of work on which certificated drivers may be employed.

16.—(1.) The holder of a first class certificate may drive and have charge of any engine.

(2.) The holder of a second class certificate may have charge of any engine (except a winding engine or winding machinery by means whereof persons or material are drawn up, down or along any shaft, pit or inclined place or level in any mine) the area of the cylinder, or the aggregate area of the cylinders, of which does not exceed two hundred and twenty-five inches, and may have charge of the boilers of any such engine.

(3.) The holder of a third class certificate may drive and have charge of any engine (except a winding engine) the area of the cylinder, or the aggregate area of the cylinders of which does not exceed one hundred inches, and may have charge of the boilers of any such engine.

(4.) The holder of a certificate of any class may have charge of any boiler to which no machinery is attached and may act as boiler attendant.

Drivers, &c., of engines and boilers to hold certificates.

17.—(1.) No person shall be employed or act in the capacity of engine-driver or engineer in charge of any engine or steam boiler to which this Ordinance applies or act as boiler attendant of any such boiler, unless he is the holder of a certificate of competency under this Ordinance of the class prescribed for the engine or boiler in question.

(2.) Every person who employs in the capacity of engine-driver or engineer in charge of any engine or steam boiler to which this Ordinance applies any person who is not the holder of the proper certificate of competency shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds.

(3.) Any person who acts in the capacity of engine-driver or engineer in charge of any engine or steam boiler to which this Ordinance applies or acts as boiler attendant of any such boiler without the proper certificate of competency shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Thirty pounds.

Fees for certificates.

18. There shall be payable in respect of the issue of certificates under this Ordinance the fees set out in the Second Schedule to this Ordinance.

No admission to engine-room.

19. No person (other than a person employed in the engine-room) shall enter any engine-room while the machinery is in motion, unless he possesses an order in writing from the Manager of the mine or other place at which the engine is installed, or is accompanied by the Manager or some person authorized by the Manager.

Penalty: Fifty pounds.

Interference with engine-drivers.

20. Any person who converses with or interferes with, or in any way draws the attention of an engine-driver in charge of a winding engine shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

Penalty: Fifty pounds.

Register of certificates.

21. A register shall be kept by the Director of Mines of all certificates granted under this Ordinance.

22.—(1.) Where it appears to the Board that the holder of a certificate under this Ordinance is guilty of any offence or misconduct or has developed any symptom of epilepsy or other serious complaint which would render him unfit to efficiently perform his duties as such holder, the Board may suspend his certificate and call upon him to show cause within thirty days why his certificate should not be cancelled.

(2.) If the holder of a certificate fails, within the prescribed time to show cause why his certificate should not be cancelled, or, if the Board is satisfied that the holder is guilty of any offence or misconduct or has developed any symptom of epilepsy or other serious complaint which would render him unfit to efficiently perform his duties as such holder, the Board may cancel his certificate.

(3.) The decision of the Board shall be final and conclusive.

23. The provisions of this Ordinance shall not apply to duly certificated Marine Engineers.

Regulations.

24.—(1.) The Administrator may make regulations, not inconsistent with this Ordinance, prescribing all matters or things which are required or permitted to be prescribed, or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed, for carrying out or giving effect to this Ordinance.

(2.) All such regulations shall be notified in the *Gazette* of the Northern Territory and shall thereupon have the force of law.

(3.) The Minister may, by notice in the *Gazette*, disallow any regulation, and thereupon such regulation shall cease to have effect.
