NDER the powers conferred upon me by Sections 86 and 87 of the Defence Act 1903-1918, I, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby delegate to you or the Officer on whom your command may devolve during your absence not under the rank of Field Officer full power and authority, from time to time as occasion may require, to convene General Courts Martial and District Courts Martial, and to appoint officers to constitute such Courts Martial, and to confirm the finding or finding and sentence thereof, or send back the finding and sentence or either of them for revision, and to mitigate or remit the punishment or any part of the punishment awarded by any sentence or commute the punishment for any less punishment to which the offender might have been sentenced by the Court Martial and to suspend the execution or currency by the Court Martial and to suspend the execution or currency of any sentence:

Provided always that if by the sentence of any General Court Martial any person subject to Military Law has been sentenced to suffer death or penal servitude, or if a commissioner officer has been sentenced to be cashiered or dismissed from the Service, you shall in such cases, as also in the case of any other Court Martial in which you shall think fit so to do, withhold confirmation and transmit the proceedings to me. ings to me.

And for so doing, this shall be, as well to you as to all others whom it may concern, a sufficient warrant.

Rabbit Destruction Ordinance 1919.

UNDER SECTION 33 OF THE ABOVE MENTIONED ORDINANCE TO OWNERS OR OCCU-PIERS WITHIN THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA

AUSTRADIA.

In pursuance of the provisions of section 33 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1919, notice is hereby given by the Minister that the owners or occupiers of all or any lands within the abovementioned Territory shall, one or before the second day of May, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, respectively commence the work of suppressing and destroying rabbits and noxious animals, upon such lands and upon any roads bounding or intersecting the saine. The period during which the said work shall be continued and systematically carried outshall be from the 2nd May, 1921, to 31st December, 1921. The means which shall be adopted for carrying out the said work shall be poison, digging out, or trapping, being means which have been previously sanctioned under the said Act. This cancels the notice which appeared in the Commonwealth Gazette of 10th March, 1921.






