PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of
Australia to wit.
FORSTER,
Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-
General of the Commonwealth
of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Arbitration (Public Service) Act 1920* it is enacted that that Act shall commence on a date to be fixed by Proclamation.

Now therefore I, Henry William, Baron Forster, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby fix the thirty-first day of March, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, as the date upon which the *Arbitration (Public Service) Act 1920* shall commence.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth, at Sydney, this thirty-first day of March, in (L.S.) the year of our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and in the eleventh year of His Majesty's reign.

PROCLAMATION

Australia to wit.
FORSTER,
Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-
General of the Commonwealth
of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Navigation Act 1912-1920* it is enacted that that Act shall commence on a day to be fixed by Proclamation after the King's approval thereto has been proclaimed in the Commonwealth:

And whereas it is further enacted by the said Act that it shall not be necessary to proclaim that the whole Act shall commence on the one date, but the several Parts, Divisions, Sections, and Schedules may be proclaimed to commence on such-dates as are respectively fixed by Proclamation:

And whereas the King's approval to the said Act has been proclaimed in the Commonwealth:

Now therefore I, Henry William, Baron Forster, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby fix the First day of July, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one as the date upon which the following Part, Sections, and Schedules of the *Navigation Act 1912-1920*, namely:—

Sections 1, 1A, 2, 3, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 14, 43, 44, 47A, 50, 77, 85, 88, 91, 92, 122A, 132, 135, 136, 137, 138, 187, 204A, 259 to 265A inclusive, 269A, Part VI. (namely, sections 284 to 293 inclusive), sections 317A, 378, 379, 380, 384, 386, 387, 389, 391 to 396 inclusive, 399 to 405 inclusive, 407, 410A, 413, 414, 416, 418A, 422, 423, 423A, 424, 425, Schedules I., II., IV., and V.

shall commence; and the First day of October, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, as the date upon which section 231 of that Act shall commence.
