PROCLAMATION

Australia to wit.
FORSTER,
Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-
General of the Commonwealth of
Australia.

WHEREAS by section seventy-two of the *Commonwealth Public Service Act 1902-1918* it is among other things provided that the Governor-General may by Proclamation at any time for any special occasion appoint, in addition to the days named in the said section any specified day to be observed as a holiday in the Public Offices of the Commonwealth or in any part thereof:

And whereas it is desired to appoint a day to be observed as a holiday for the purpose of the commemoration of Anzac Day:

Now therefore I, Henry William, Baron Forster, the Governor-General aforesaid, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Act, do hereby appoint the twenty-fifth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, to be observed as a holiday in all the Public Offices of the Commonwealth of Australia.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth, this sixth day of April, in the year of our Lord One (L.S.) thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and in the eleventh year of His Majesty's reign.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by the *New Guinea Act 1920* it is enacted that that Act shall commence on a date to be fixed by Proclamation:

Now therefore I, Henry William, Baron Forster, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby fix Monday, the ninth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, as the date upon which the *New Guinea Act 1920* shall commence.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth (L.S.) this seventh day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.
