NORTHERN TERRITORY OF AUSTRALIA.

No. 10 of 1921.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend "The Jury Act 1862" of the State of South Australia, as amended by "The Jury Act Further Amendment Act 1907" of that State, in its application to the Northern Territory.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Northern Territory Acceptance Act 1910-1919* and the *Northern Territory (Administration) Act 1910*, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Jury Ordinance 1921*. Short title.
2. Section forty-four of *The Jury Act 1862* of the State of South Australia, as amended by *The Jury Act Further Amendment Act 1907* of that State, in its application to the Northern Territory, is amended— Fees payable for juries in civil action.
 - (a) by omitting the words "Five pounds" (wherever occurring) and inserting in their stead the words "Ten pounds"; and
 - (b) by omitting the words "Ten shillings" and inserting in their stead the words "Seventeen shillings and sixpence."

REDISTRIBUTION OF THE STATES OF NEW SOUTH WALES, VICTORIA, QUEENSLAND, SOUTH AUSTRALIA, AND TASMANIA, INTO ELECTORAL DIVISIONS, PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE COMMONWEALTH ELECTORAL ACT 1918-1919.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Governor-General of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918-1919* it is enacted that a redistribution of any State into Electoral Divisions for the election of Members of the House of Representatives shall be made in the manner therein provided whenever directed by the Governor-General, by Proclamation, and that such Proclamation may be made at such times as the Governor-General thinks fit:

Now therefore I, Henry William, Baron Forster, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and direct that a redistribution of the States of New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia, and Tasmania, into Electoral Divisions, shall forthwith be made in the manner directed by the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918-1919*.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth, this eleventh day of October, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and in the twelfth year of His Majesty's reign.

SPIRIT USED IN FORTIFYING AUSTRALIAN WINES.

(Excise Regulations 1913, Nos. 76 and 78 (T. & C. 21/A.6645) and Customs Regulations 1913, No. 130.)

DRAWBACK of the full amount of Excise Duty paid may be allowed under the provisions of the Excise Regulations 1913 and the Customs Regulations 1913, on spirit in excess of 26 per cent. proof spirit, actually contained in Australian sweet wines and sherry type wines upon the exportation of such wines and after compliance with the said regulations.

Provided that the fortification shall take place under the supervision of an officer and that, in each case, before drawback is allowed, the collector shall be absolutely satisfied that the drawback claimed is properly due.

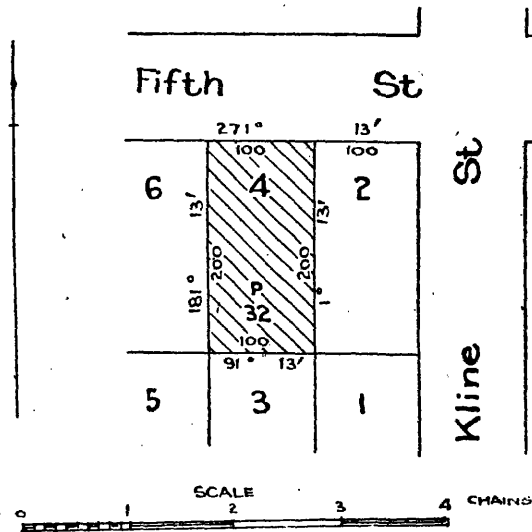

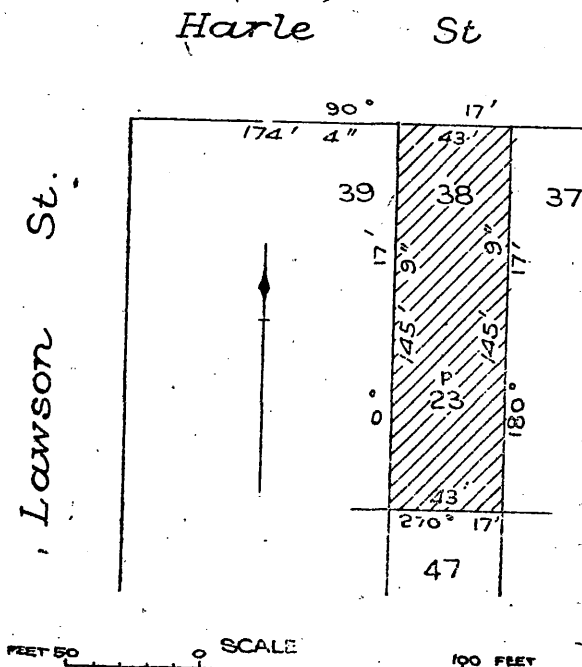
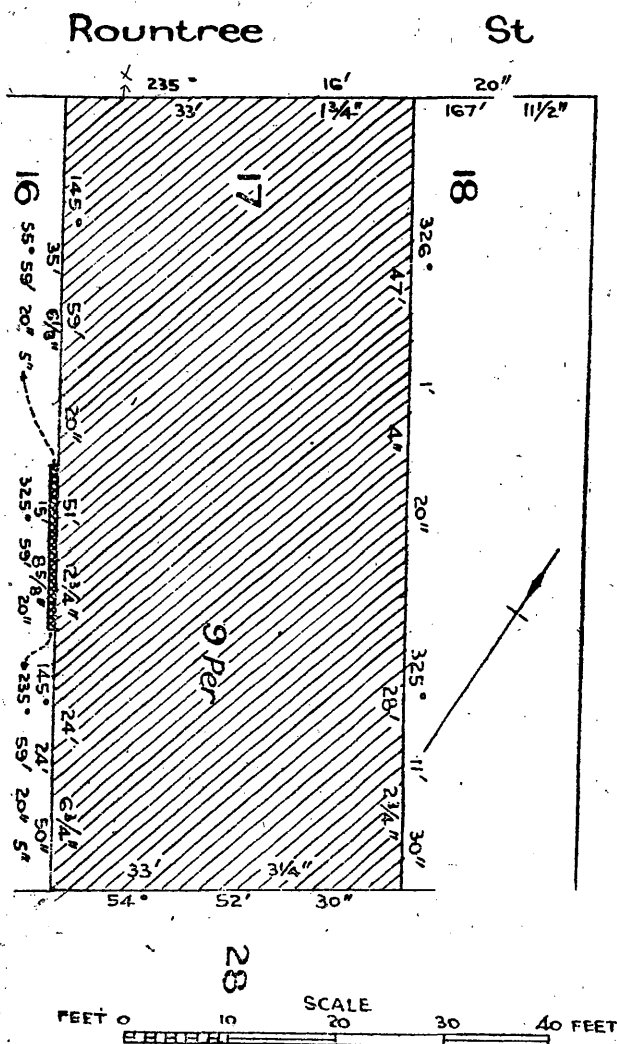
