THE NORTHERN TERRITORY OF AUSTRALIA.

No. 4 of 1922.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Darwin Town Council Ordinance 1915-1921.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General of the Commonwalth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Northern Territory Acceptance Act 1910-1919 and the Northern Territory (Administration) Act 1910 as follows:—

- 1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Darwin Town Council Short title and citation.
- (2.) The Darwin Town Council Ordinance 1915-1921 is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.
- (3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Darwin Town Council Ordinance* 1915–1922.
- 2. Section twenty-two of the Principal Ordinance is amended by compilation of inserting after sub-section (4.) thereof the following sub-sections:—

 Compilation of electoral roll.
 - "(4A.) Subject to this section the occupier of any rateable property in respect of which all sums payable as a general rate have been paid shall be entitled to have his name enrolled on the electoral roll in respect of that property.
 - (4B.) Where the owner of any rateable property pays the general rate in respect of that property he shall thereupon, subject to this section, be entitled to have his name enrolled on the electoral roll in lieu of that of the occupier.

- (40.) Where two or more persons are owners of the same property and pay the general rate in respect of, but do not occupy, the property, the owner whose name appears first in order on the Register of Title of the property shall be entitled to be enrolled in respect of that property.
- (4p.) Where two or more persons are owners of the same property and pay the general rate under this Ordinance in respect of the property and only one of the owners occupies the property, the owner occupying the property shall be entitled to be enrolled in respect of that property.
- (4E.) Where two or more persons are owners of the same property and more than one of those persons are occupiers of the property, the occupying owner whose name appears first in order on the Register of Title of the property shall be entitled to be enrolled in respect of that property.
- (4f.) Where there are two or more occupiers of the same property who are not owners of the property but who pay the general rate under this Ordinance in respect of the property, that occupier whose name appears first in order in the Assessment Book shall be entitled to have his name enrolled in respect of the property.
- (4c.) Where a corporation pays the general rate in respect of any property the corporation may by writing under its common seal delivered to the Town Clerk appoint a person to be enrolled on the electoral roll in respect of that property and that person shall be deemed to be a ratepayer of the Council within the meaning of section nineteen of this Ordinance.
- (4H.) No person shall be entitled to have his name enrolled on the electoral roll in respect of any rateable property in respect of which all amounts due by way of general rate have not been paid and in no case shall more than one person be entitled to be enrolled in respect of the same property."
