#### PROCLAMATION

Australia to wit. FORSTER, Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia.

W HEREAS by the New Zealand Re-exports Act 1924 it is enacted that this Act shall commence on a date to be fixed by Proclamation after the Governor-General is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand in relation to goods, not of Australian produce or manifesture, which are imported into that Dominion from Australia:

And whereas the Governor-General is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand in relation to goods, not of Australian produce or manufacture, which are imported into that Dominion from Australia:

And whereas it is desirable that the said Act shall commence on the first day of October, 1925:

Now therefore I, Henry William, Baron Forster, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby fix Thursday, the first day of October, 1925, as the date upon which the said Act shall commence.

Given under my hand and the seal of the Commonwealth of Australia, at Sydney, this twentieth day of May, (L.S.) in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, and in the sixteenth year of His Majesty's reign.



## CLASSIFICATION UNDER SECTION 27, "PUBLIC SERVICE ACT 1922-1924."

HE Public Service Board of Commissioners hereby notifies for the information of officers concerned the following classification of a section of the Commonwealth Service.

The classification of offices and officers shall take effect as from 1st July, 1924, except where otherwise shown.

Any officer whose salary as at the date of Governor-General's approval of the classification of this section is in excess of the maximum of the limits of salary within which his office is classified shall continue to receive the excess payment until the expiration of twelve months from that date. Provided that the classification shall not reduce the salary of any officer, so long as he occupies the office in which he is classified, below the amount at present received by him under any Determination made under the Arbitration (Public Service) Act 1920, or below the amount which he would be entitled to receive under any such Determination up to the date of approval of the last classified section of the Commonwealth Service.

The payment of annual increments of salary shall, except where otherwise shown in the appropriate column and subject to the preceding paragraph, commence as from 1st July, 1925.

Child endowment where paid will be continued as prescribed in Public Service Regulation 86.

Existing conditions as to payment of district allowances shall be continued subject to adjustment of overpayments by the amount of any salary increase allotted by classification.

Allowances payable under Public Service Regulation 96 to junior officers residing away from home will be continued as prescribed in that regulation.

Allowances in the nature of salary, other than those covered by the preceding paragraphs, whether granted under Regulations or Arbitration Determinations, shall be discontinued as from the date of Governor-General's approval of the classification of this section, unless included as part of the classification or otherwise approved by the Board after the date of this notification,

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Any officer dissatisfied with the classification as affecting himself or his office may forward, within thirty (30) days after the date of this Gazette, a notice of appeal, addressed to the Board through the Public Service Inspector of the State in which the officer is employed, setting forth the grounds of his dissatisfaction.
