ORDER UNDER SECTION 422A.

### EXEMPTION FROM COASTING TRADE PROVISIONS OF THE ACT OF SHIPS CARRYING CARGO UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES.

WHEREAS by Section 422A of the *Navigation Act 1912-1926* it is among other things enacted that where the Governor-General is satisfied, as regards any ship or class of ships, that such circumstances exist as render compliance with any specified requirement of that Act impracticable, or make insistence upon compliance with that requirement undesirable in the public interest, he may by Order direct that that ship or class of ships shall not be required to comply with that requirement:

And whereas it is by the said section further enacted that any direction under that section may be unconditional or subject to such conditions, limitations and restrictions as are expressed in the Order:

And whereas it is by the said Act required that ships engaging in the coasting trade shall comply with certain requirements specified in the sections and Schedules set out in the First Schedule to this Order:

And whereas I am satisfied that such circumstances exist as make insistence upon compliance with those requirements undesirable in the public interest:

Now therefore I, Sir Philip Woolcott Gamie, deputy of the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby direct that a ship engaging in the coasting trade by reason only of the carriage of cargo of the description and subject to the conditions, limitations and restrictions set out in the Second Schedule to this Order shall not be required to comply with the

aforesaid requirements specified in the sections and Schedules set out in the First Schedule to this Order.

Where, on the application of the master, owner or agent of a ship for which exemption under this Order is desired, the Deputy-Director of Navigation for the State first certifies that he is satisfied that a ship licensed to engage in the coasting trade, or holding, or eligible to obtain and hold, a permit to engage in the coasting trade, is not available for the service required.

*Customs Tariff Proposals* of 13th October, 1932, Item 180(B)(2)(a).

## PARTS OF GAS METERS.

By-law No. 2735, published in *Gazette*, No. 77, dated 3rd November, 1932, is hereby amended by deleting therefrom the following references, viz.:—

- "(5) Coin mechanisms for prepayment meters"
- "(6) Indexes for all types of meters"

but any goods which were in direct transit to Australia on 23rd January, 1933, or were in bond in Australia on that date, and which, but for this By-law, would be admissible under Tariff Item 180(B)(2)(a) may be admitted under that Tariff Item, if entered for home consumption—

- (a) as regards goods in direct transit—on arrival;
- (b) as regards goods in bond—on or before 23rd February, 1933.

## BY-LAW No. 2859.

By-law No. 2818, published in *Gazette*, No. 90, dated 22nd December, 1932, having reference to Permanent Magnets for use in the manufacture of Magnetic Pick-ups and of Tone Arms is hereby amended by deleting therefrom the date "11th September, 1932" and inserting in its stead the date "30th August, 1932". (T.D. 33/2.)

*Customs Tariff Proposals* of 13th October, 1932, Item 404.

MATERIALS AND MINOR ARTICLES, OF A CLASS OR KIND NOT COMMERCIALY PRODUCED OR MANUFACTURED IN AUSTRALIA, FOR USE IN THE MANUFACTURE OF GOODS WITHIN THE COMMONWEALTH.

The materials and minor articles shown in the second column of the table hereunder may be admitted under Tariff Item 404 for use in the manufacture within the Commonwealth of the articles shown respectively opposite such materials or minor articles in the first column of the table.

As to all the goods shown in the second column, the qualification, unless otherwise expressly stated, applies that they must not be partly or wholly of gold or silver, but, unless the contrary is specially stated, goods merely gold-plated or silver-plated are not excluded.

No By-law made under Tariff Item 404 shall apply to any goods which otherwise are goods not included in the Customs Tariff:—

"Air brake equipments (excepting slack adjusters, sandbox castings, cut-out cocks, drain cocks, electric portion of air compressors, air brake cylinders, fuses and holders, air gauges, governors, mufflers, reservoirs, strainers, compressor switches; emergency valves, motorman's brake valves, relay or quick service valves, safety valves, and sander valves) for use in the manufacture of tramcars."

## BY-LAW No. 2857.

## Item 404.

By-law No. 2773, published in *Gazette*, No. 77, dated 3rd November, 1932, as subsequently amended, is hereby further amended by adding the undermentioned to the list of goods excepted from admission under that By-law, viz.:—

"Plain unpolished iron and steel plates and sheets including trapezoidal shaped, viz.:—

(1) of greater thickness than 3-16th inch, except plates 14 inches, 16 inches and 18 inches wide by  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch to 1 inch in thickness, both thicknesses inclusive.

(2) of 3-16ths inch in thickness, if exceeding 48 inches in width or if over a total area of 16 square feet for all purposes",

but any goods which were in direct transit to Australia on 23rd January, 1933, or were in bond in Australia on that date, and which but for this By-law, would be admissible under Tariff Item 404, may be admitted under that Tariff Item, if entered for home consumption—

- (a) as regards goods in direct transit—on arrival.
- (b) as regards goods in bond—on or before 23rd February, 1933.

With regard to the plates and sheets referred to in (2), admission under Tariff Item 404 is subject to the condition that the Collector be first satisfied—

- (a) that the particular sizes imported are essential for a definite purpose and that security be given that the materials will be used only in such sizes for such purpose; or
- (b) that if cut after importation, the resultant sections are essential for a definite purpose and that such resultant sections could not have been cut from plates and sheets smaller than those specified in (2) and that security be given that the sections will be used only in such sizes and for such purpose.

MANUFACTURES IMPORTED FOR USE IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF AN AUSTRALIAN INDUSTRY OR OF THE NATURAL RESOURCES OF AUSTRALIA, OR FOR USE IN PUBLIC HOSPITALS OR PUBLIC EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, OF FOR USE BY PUBLIC UTILITIES ESTABLISHED UNDER COMMONWEALTH OR STATE LAW AND NOT CONDUCTED FOR PRIVATE GAIN.

The following manufactures, being of a class or kind not commercially manufactured in Australia or the United Kingdom, may be admitted under Tariff Item 415A(1), viz.:—

Separators, cream—

Having a capacity greater than 175 gallons per hour.

Parts which, but for this By-law, would be classifiable under Tariff Item 160(b)(1), of cream separators having a capacity up to and including 175 gallons per hour, for replacement purposes only, under security.

#### BY-LAW No. 2861.

*Customs Tariff Proposals of 13th October, 1932, Item 415A(2).*

MANUFACTURES IMPORTED FOR USE IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF AN AUSTRALIAN INDUSTRY OR OF THE NATURAL RESOURCES OF AUSTRALIA, OR FOR USE IN PUBLIC HOSPITALS OR PUBLIC EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, OF FOR USE BY PUBLIC UTILITIES ESTABLISHED UNDER COMMONWEALTH OR STATE LAW AND NOT CONDUCTED FOR PRIVATE GAIN.

The following manufactures, being of a class or kind not commercially manufactured in Australia, and not being admissible under Item 174, 219(c), 404 or 415A(1), may be admitted under Tariff Item 415A(2), viz.:—

Chain, iron and steel, wrought, composed of links manufactured from metal  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch and over in diameter, for use in mooring gas buoys and vessels, provided that the Collector be satisfied that the chain has withstood a test equivalent to the Admiralty proof strain, under security.

By-law No. 2775, published in *Gazette*, No. 77, dated 3rd November, 1932, as subsequently amended, is hereby further amended by adding the undermentioned to the list of goods excepted from admission under that By-law, viz.:—

“Wrought iron and steel chain composed of welded links manufactured from metal  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch and over in diameter, for use in mooring gas buoys and vessels, provided that the Collector be satisfied that the chain has withstood a test equivalent to the Admiralty proof strain, under security.”

(Operating on and from 6th January, 1933.) (T.D. 33/7.)

#### BY-LAW No. 2862.

*Customs Tariff Proposals of 13th October, 1932, Item 419(c)(2).*

SURGICAL AND DENTAL AND VETERINARY INSTRUMENTS, APPLIANCES AND MATERIALS (BUT NOT INCLUDING FURNITURE NOT SPECIFICALLY MENTIONED IN THIS ITEM.)

By-law No. 2777, published in *Gazette*, No. 77, dated 3rd November, 1932, is hereby amended by adding “Electrically

operated dental operating units” to the list of instruments and appliances excepted from admission under Tariff Item 419(c)(2); but any goods which were in direct transit to Australia on 23rd January, 1933, or were in bond in Australia on that date, and which, but for this By-law, would be admissible under Tariff Item 419(c)(2), may be admitted under that Tariff Item, if entered for home consumption—

- (a) as regards goods in direct transit—on arrival;
- (b) as regards goods in bond—on or before 23rd February, 1933.
