Regulations under the Nurses Registration Ordinance 1933.

I CHARLES WILLIAM CLANAN MARR, Minister of State for Health, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Nurses Registration Ordinance 1933*, hereby make the following Regulations to come into operation forthwith.

“This fee shall cover the registration of any person in one or more branches of the nursing profession if that registration is effected at one meeting of the Board.”;

No. 4 of 1933.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the *Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance 1930-1931*.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1931*, as follows:—

Short title and
citation.

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance 1933*.

(2.) The *Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance 1930-1931* is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance 1930-1933*.

Commencement.

2. This Ordinance, except sections four and eight, shall be deemed to have commenced on the twelfth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two; section four shall be deemed to have commenced on the date of the commencement of the *Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance 1930*; and section eight on the date of the notification of this Ordinance in the *Gazette*.

3. Section four of the Principal Ordinance is amended—

(a) by omitting the words “at the commencement of the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1930*” and inserting in their stead the words “on the twelfth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two”;

(b) by omitting paragraph (c) of sub-section (1.);

(c) by omitting paragraph (j) of sub-section (1.) and inserting in its stead the following paragraphs:—

“(j) any reference to the Minister of State for Works and Railways, the Minister for Works and Railways, the Minister of State for Home and Territories, the Minister for Home and Territories, the Minister of State for Home Affairs or the Minister for Home Affairs shall be read as a reference to the Minister of State for the Interior;

“(k) any reference to the Department of Works and Railways, Department of Home and Territories or the Department of Home Affairs shall be read as a reference to the Department of the Interior; and

“(l) any reference to the Civic Administrator, the Federal Capital Territory Branch of the Department of Home Affairs, the Secretary, Department of State for Home Affairs or the Secretary, Department of Home Affairs shall be read as a reference to the Minister”.

4.—(1.) After section four of the Principal Ordinance, the following sections are inserted:—

Grant of leases

“4A.—Where in any Ordinance (including any Regulations made thereunder) authority is conferred on the Minister to grant leases, any such lease shall be granted by the Minister in the name of the Commonwealth.

"4b.—(1.) Where, in any lease granted under any Ordinance (including any Regulations made thereunder), before or after the commencement of this Ordinance, authority is conferred on the Commonwealth or the Commission to determine the lease, the Minister may exercise that authority as fully and effectually as if the authority were conferred on the Minister by the lease. Power of Minister to determine leases.

"(2.) Where, under any Ordinance (including any Regulations made thereunder) or in any instrument made thereunder, authority is conferred on the Minister to determine any lease, the Minister may delegate authority to any person to determine such leases.

"4c. Where, under section eighty-six of the *Real Property Ordinance* 1925-1930, authority is conferred on the Minister to accept the surrender of a lease, that authority may be exercised by the Minister for the time being administering the Ordinance relating to the leasing of land in the Territory and the surrender of any such lease may be accepted by the Minister in the name of the Commonwealth. Acceptance of surrender of leases.

"4d. Where under any Ordinance, the Minister may delegate to any person all or any of his powers under that Ordinance, the Minister may, by writing under his hand, delegate to any such person all or any of his powers or functions under any Regulations made thereunder." Power to delegate under Regulations.

5. Section six of the Principal Ordinance is amended—

- (a) by omitting the words "Home Affairs" and inserting in their stead the words "the Interior"; and
 (b) by omitting paragraph (d) and inserting in its stead the following paragraph:—
 "(d) the Treasurer". Administration of Ordinance.

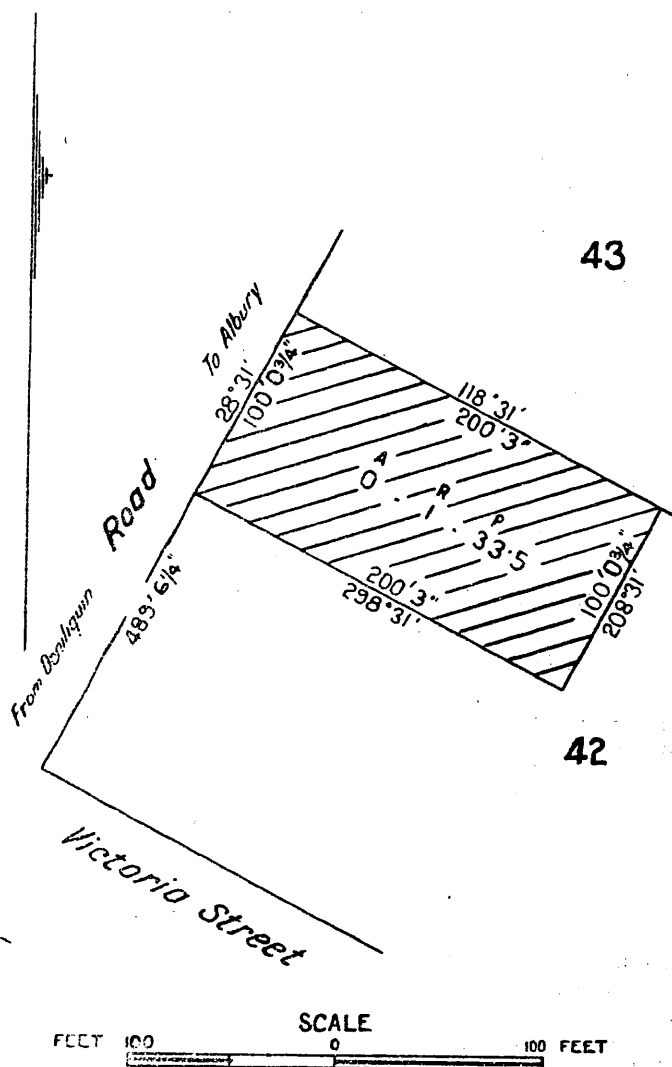

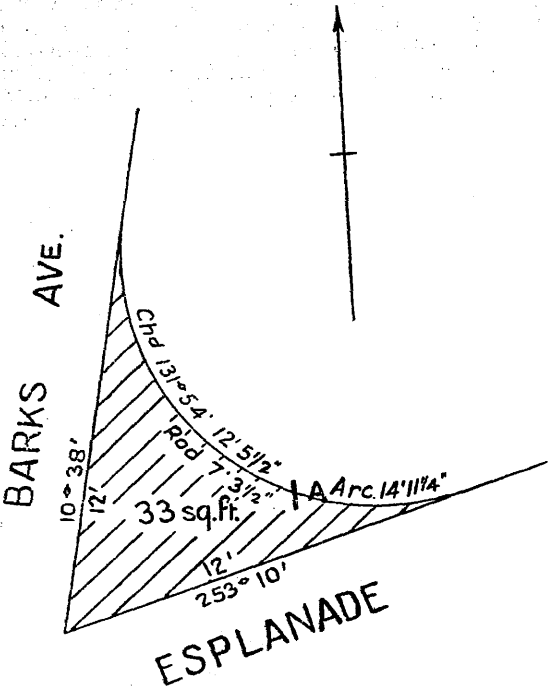

FOR PROMOTION OR TRANSFER AS SENIOR MECHANIC (RESEARCH), POSTMASTER-GENERAL'S DEPARTMENT, CENTRAL STAFF.

A QUALIFYING Examination, as above, will be held under the following conditions:—

Date of Examination.—The written examination will take place on Saturday, the 30th September, 1933. The practical and oral tests will take place on subsequent dates to be arranged.

Examination Centres.—The written examination will be held in capital cities and at such country centres as it is convenient to arrange the examination. The practical and oral tests will, however, take place only in the capital cities of the States.

Officers Eligible to Enter.—The examination will be confined to permanent officers of the Commonwealth Public Service who are classified as Mechanic, Grade 2, or as Senior Mechanic.

For a "laboratory" position a candidate must pass in sections (a) and (b); and for a "radio" position, in sections (a) and (c). A candidate may, however, elect to undergo examination in all sections. The written theoretical examinations will be held first. A candidate who is successful will be eligible to undergo the practical tests, and if he passes therein, will be permitted to proceed with the oral examination.

General knowledge of construction of receiving and transmitting tubes;
Operating conditions for—
(i) modulators and demodulators (or detectors);
(ii) amplifiers, radio frequency and audio frequency;
Use in R.F. oscillators.

(ii) Radio receivers—

General circuit design;
The functions of the circuit elements and components of receiving sets;
Types of radio-frequency amplifier couplings;
Types of detectors;
Types of audio frequency amplifier couplings;

These divisions of the examination which will be quite distinct and for which the marks will be awarded quite separately, will consist of questions regarding any of the items in the foregoing syllabus of practical tests, together with other questions from the following theoretical syllabus: which latter questions will be designed to test the candidate's knowledge of the theoretical principles underlying the work of a Senior Mechanic in the Research Laboratories.

Fundamental principles: Elementary conception of electronic flow and thermionic emission;
General properties of electron tubes: Amplification factor, mutual conductance, plate-filament A.C. and D.C. resistance;
Types of electron tubes and their principal uses.

(b) Laboratory:

Alternating current transmission, elementary theory—

Transmission terms and their explanation;
Outlines of methods of determining losses and power relations in communication circuits;
Elements of alternating current bridge methods of measurement.

(c) Radio:

(i) General theory—

Elementary theory of wave motion and wave propagation;
Elementary principles of oscillation generators oscillatory circuits, coupled circuits, radiating circuits (aerials).
Types of waves used in radio communication (C.W., I.C.W., and speech modulated);
Attenuation of radio waves, including influence of surrounding country and buildings;
Atmospheric disturbances;
General practical utility of long, medium and short waves for particular classes of service.

(ii) Field-intensity measurements—

Method of measuring the strength of the electric field produced by transmitters;
 Precautions to be observed in measurements.
 Definition of the units used.
 Field-intensity surveys and their uses.

(iii) Transmitters—

General knowledge of design and operation of radio transmitters.
 Methods of ensuring frequency stability;
 Types of modulation;
 Types of amplifiers;
 Types of coupling between stages and between transmitters and aerial.

Exemption from Examination.—As this is the first examination for Senior Mechanic, Research, no exemptions will be granted in any section of the examination. Further, no officer who has passed an examination for Senior Mechanic in another branch of the Department will be considered as having qualified for the position of Senior Mechanic, Research.

Travelling Expenses.—Officers who are required to travel from a country station to the metropolis for the purpose of attendance at examinations for advancement may apply to the Chief Officer for refund of the cost of conveyance necessarily incurred in such attendance. Payment will be subject to the approval of the Board, and may be disallowed if the results of the examination do not warrant refund.

Order of Transfer or Promotion.—In filling vacancies for Senior Mechanic, Research, successful candidates at this examination will be promoted in the order of their seniority as Mechanics. In this connexion, the sections of the examination passed and their relation to the duties of a vacant position will have consideration.
